Re: Beaver & Brooks Drain, 106th & Hoosier Road Roundabout Partial Vacation, Station 0+00 to Station 0+70

Attached are the petition by the City of Fishers and plans for the proposed vacation of a portion of the Beaver & Brooks Drain. This project is to be paid for by the City of Fishers. In order to facilitate site improvements for a roundabout, the proposal is to vacate 70' of the existing drain per the construction plans by GIA filed at the County Surveyor's Office on 10/31/2022, revision dated 10/9/2023, project No. 1801420.

The original Beaver & Brooks Drain began with a petition by Marion and Nancy Beaver and Sam Brooks presented to the County Commissioners in June 1897. Following a Viewers Report in July 1897 and a Reviewer's Report in November 1897. the drain was challenged and referred to the Circuit Court in December 1897. In June 1903 the remonstrance was withdrawn, and the drain was ordered to be constructed. In September 1904, the Commissioners extended the contractors completion time. See Commissioner's Record Book 10, pages 508-542; CR Book 14, page 304; CR Book 14, page 466; and CR Book 15, page 332.

The proposed drain vacation is located at the northwest corner of the intersection of 106th & Hoosier Road, in the City of Fishers. Per the plans by GIA, a portion of the existing Beaver & Brooks tile will be vacated within the proposed roundabout improvements. The vacation will be located within the right of way for 106th & Hoosier Road, owned by the City of Fishers.

The vacation will consist of the following:

70' of 8" Clay field tile

The length of the vacation will be 70'. This project will subtract 70' from the overall length of the Beaver & Brooks Drain. Within the project limits, the 70' of existing tile installed in 1904 as part of the Beaver & Brooks Drain will be vacated. The existing drain to be vacated approximately equates to the following stations of the original 1904 drain: Sta. 0+00 to 0+70. To help identify this location, which will become the new upstream end of the regulated drain, a breather will be installed. The existing drain downstream of this location shall remain at this time.

Regarding easement, the easement will be vacated only for the portion of the drain being vacated. Per IC 36-9-27-33, the easement is measured at right angles 75' from the centerline of the tile.

This proposal meets the criteria for vacation of a regulated drain as laid out in IC-36-9-27-34.

I recommend the Board set the hearing for January 22, 2024.

FINDINGS AND ORDER

Evidence has been heard. Objections were presented and considered. The Board then adopted an order of action. The Board now finds that the costs of continued maintenance to the portion of the above drain exceed the benefits to the real estate benefited by the portion of the drain to be abandoned and issues this order vacating the above section of the Beaver & Brooks Drain, 106^{th} & Hoosier Road Roundabout Partial Vacation (Station 0+00 to Station 0+70).
