

RE: Vincent Case Drain

Attached is a proposed profile for dredging the Vincent Case Drain. The dredging is proposed in order to improve flow from the tile. The proposal is being presented as a reconstruction of the Vincent Case Drain.

At this time the open ditch at the outlet to the Vincent Case Drain is at a higher elevation than the tile drain. In order to relieve the tile, the attached dredging plan is proposed. This plan will extend the drain another 500 feet past STA 47+30 as described in the 1903 Viewers Report. Because of this the project must be done as a reconstruction, even though the drain is set up on a maintenance program. The cost estimate for the work is as follows:

Since there are 301.17 acres within the drainage shed, the reconstruction cost will be \$11.60 an acre, \$15.00 minimum.

At this time the Vincent Case Drain has an annual collection of \$311.50 for maintenance. The current balance in the fund is \$85.59. The maintenance cost for the last three (3) years is as follows:

1985 ----- \$573.20 1987 ____ \$126.50 1986 ----- \$825.30

The average cost over these years is \$508.33, which is more than the annual collections. Considering that the drain was set up on a maintenance program in 1972 at \$1.00 per acre, \$3.00 minimum, when costs were lower and the current

have been higher.

balance and costs over the last three (3) years, I recommend the assessment be increased. I recommend the drain be assessed at \$2.00 per acre with a \$10.00 minimum. This would bring in \$658.08 per year and hopefully keep an adequate fund balance for some time in the future.

I recommend a hearing be set for October 1988.

RE: Vincent Case Drain

In December an inspection was made of the reconstruction of the open ditch portion of the Vincent Case Drain as contracted by William Noland and Son. At that time I found the work which was performed to be complete and acceptable.

The contract was completed in a timely manner in as much as the weather in 1989 allowed. The drain was reconstructed without change orders issued, so that no deviation from the original contract was involved.

The contract price was \$2475.00 and the original estimate was \$3,492.50. At this time a claim for the eight-five (85%) percent of the contract price, \$2104.00 has been submitted. The fifteen (15%) percent retainer, \$371.00 should be paid with the next claim cycle. A statement from the contractor for payment of all expenses being paid has been filed. The reconstruction assessment has been certified to the Auditor for the original estimate on December 8, 1988.

I recommend the Board order the claims paid and accept the work as complete.
