

Attached is information for the  $116^{th}$  Street Reconstruction of the Castetter and Randall Drain. An inspection of the drainage facilities for this section has been made and the facilities were found to be complete and acceptable.

During construction, changes were made to the drain, which will alter the plans submitted with my report for this drain-dated November 24, 1997. The report was approved by the Board at the hearing held November 24, 1997. (See Drainage Board Minutes Book 4, Page 482)

The drain was relocated and upsized from 12" RCP to 15" RCP. This took place from Sta 0 in the south right of way to the north right of way of 116<sup>th</sup> Street. Therefore, 72 feet of drain was replaced.

I recommend the Board approve the drain's construction as complete and acceptable.
