Re: Cool Creek Drain, Farr Hills Extension

Attached is a drain map for the Cool Creek Drain, Farr Hills Extension. This proposed drain is located in Washington Township.

I have made a personal inspection of the land described below. Upon doing so, I believe that the drain is practicable, will improve the public health, benefit a highway and be of public utility and that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed drain will probably be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of land likely to be benefited. The drain will consist of the following:

Open Ditch – 816 feet

The Cool Creek Drain, Farr Hills Extension shall begin at the west boundary line of Farr Hills Subdivision, which is the current terminus of the Cool Creek Drain, Kenyon-Harmon Clark Extension, per my report dated November 3, 2006 and approved by the Board at hearing on February 26, 2007 (See Hamilton County Drainage Board Minutes Book 10, Pages 103 to 105), thence running downstream within the existing Cool Creek Tributary 816 feet to the south boundary line of Farr Hills Subdivision. This point is also the current terminus of the Cool Creek Drain, Kenyon-Harmon Clark Extension.

The nature of maintenance work required is as follows:

1. Bank erosion protection and/or seeding as might be required;
2. Removal of debris and/or blockages from existing open drain;
3. Removal of beaver dams;
4. Any other repairs necessary to restore proper flow to the open ditch.

The frequency with which maintenance work should be performed is annually as required by the condition of the drain.

The Farr Hills Arm of the Cool Creek Regulated Drain will cross the following tracts:

The Board, having considered the evidence and objections, and, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did find and determine that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed Reconstruction will be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of all land benefited by the Reconstruction.


The Board having considered the evidence and objections, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did adopt the Schedule of Assessments as proposed, subject to amendment after inspection of the subject drain as it relates to the lands of any owners which may have been erroneously included or omitted from the Schedule of Assessments.


The Board further finds that it has jurisdiction of these proceedings and that all required notices have been duly given or published as required by law.
