Attached is a drain map for the extension of the Cool Creek Drain. This proposed drain is located in Clay Township.

I have made a personal inspection of the land described below. Upon doing so, I believe that the drain is practicable, will improve the public health, benefit a public highway and be of public utility and that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed drain will probably be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of land likely to be benefited. The drain will consist of the following:

Open Ditch 1,240 ft.

The total length of the drain will be 1,240 feet.

The extension will begin at the south right of way line of Keystone Avenue, which is also the north property line of Tract 16-10-19-00-00-023.000, owned by Carmel Woods, LLC. The extension will follow the existing open ditch upstream to the east right of way line of Keystone Avenue, which is also the west property line of Tract 17-10-19-00-09-056.000, owned by Laura Vista, LLC.

The nature of maintenance work required is as follows:

- 1. Bank erosion protection and/or seeding as might be required;
- 2. Removal of debris and/or blockages from existing open drain;
- 3. Removal of beaver dams;
- 4. Any other repairs necessary to restore proper flow to the open ditch.

The frequency with which maintenance work should be performed is annually as required by the condition of the drain.

The easements for the drain should be set at 75' from top of bank as set out in IC 36-9-27-33. Additional drainage easement will be added to the following tracts:

Upon reviewing the flood mapping for this area it appears that the area to be easement lies within the floodplain. This is shown on the FEMA FIRM for the area, Map Number 18057C0226F, dated February 19, 2003. Therefore, damages shall be set at \$0.00.

I believe this proposed drain meets the requirements for Urban Drain Classification as set out in IC 36-9-27-67 to 69. Therefore, this drain shall be designated as an Urban Drain.

I recommend that the Board set a hearing for this proposal for May 27, 2008.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

We object to the Cool Creek Drain, Keystone Extension to the extent it will place an easement on our property located at 1099 N Range Line Road, in Carmel.

Our objection is based on the ground that the damages assessed to our property are inadequate.

If the easement encumbers any portion of our property on which there are improvements, the damages may be significant, as IC 36-9-27-33 (d) states: "Permanent structures may not be placed on any right-of-way without the written consent of the board." Although we have been told that any existing encroachments would be considered "grandfathered", we have not been given evidence that that would be the case, nor assurance that we would be allowed to rebuild encroaching improvements if they are damaged or destroyed (i.e., by fire).

We cannot evaluate the impact of the easement to our property because we don't know exactly where it will be on our property. Although we have requested a map or plan that would show the location of the easement, the only thing provided to us is a sketch that *estimates* the easement's location. As the banks of Cool Creek are not on our property, we have no way of determining ourselves where the easement would be.
