Re: Cool Creek Drain, Speidel Extension

Attached is a drain map for the Cool Creek Drain, Speidel Extension. This proposed drain is located in Washington Township.

I have made a personal inspection of the land described below. Upon doing so, I believe that the drain is practicable, will improve the public health, benefit a highway and be of public utility and that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed drain will probably be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of land likely to be benefited. The drain will consist of the following:

Open Ditch - 627 feet

The Cool Creek Drain, Speidel Extension shall begin at the west property line of parcel 08-09-13-00-00-004.000, owned by John & Mary Speidel, and run downstream within the existing Cool Creek Tributary 627 feet to east property line of the same parcel. Both the beginning and ending points are the current terminuses of the Cool Creek Drain, Overman Harvey/William Knight Extension, per my report dated November 3, 2006 and approved by the Board at hearing on February 26, 2007 (See Hamilton County Drainage Board Minutes Book 10, Pages 95 to 98).

The nature of maintenance work required is as follows:

- 1. Bank erosion protection and/or seeding as might be required;
- 2. Removal of debris and/or blockages from existing open drain;
- 3. Removal of beaver dams;
- 4. Any other repairs necessary to restore proper flow to the open ditch.

The frequency with which maintenance work should be performed is annually as required by the condition of the drain.

The easement for the drain on the parcels should be set at 75' from the top of bank as set out in IC 36-9-27-33. The easement on Lot 200, 204, and 205 of Village Farms, Section 3, shall be the 15 foot drainage, utility, and trail easement as shown on the secondary plat for Village Farms, Section 3, and recorded in the Office of the Hamilton County Recorder (PB 6, Pages 10 to 12). According to the FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Map, Map Number 18057C0119F, the area for the Cool Creek Open Ditch is covered by the mapped Zone A floodplain. Therefore, I believe that no damages will result to landowners by the regulating of this drain.

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FINDINGS AND ORDER FOR RECONSTRUCTION

The matter of the proposed Reconstruction of the **Cool Creek Drain, Speidel Extension** came before the Hamilton County Drainage Board for hearing **on June 28, 2010**, on the Reconstruction Report consisting of the report and the Schedule of Damages and Assessments. The Board also received and considered the written objection of an owner of certain lands affected by the proposed Reconstruction, said owner being:

Evidence was heard on the Reconstruction Report and on the aforementioned objections.

The Board, having considered the evidence and objections, and, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did find and determine that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed Reconstruction will be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of all land benefited by the Reconstruction.

The Board having considered the evidence and objections, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did adopt the Schedule of Assessments as proposed, subject to amendment after inspection of the subject drain as it relates to the lands of any owners which may have been erroneously included or omitted from the Schedule of Assessments.

The Board further finds that it has jurisdiction of these proceedings and that all required notices have been duly given or published as required by law.

Wherefore, it is ORDERED, that the proposed Reconstruction of the **Cool Creek Drain, Speidel Extension** be and is hereby declared established.

Thereafter, the Board made inspection for the purpose of determining whether or not the lands of any owners had been erroneously included or excluded from the Schedule of Assessments. The Board finds on the basis of the reports and findings at this hearing as follows:
