Re: Anna Kendall Drain - J.M. Thompson Arm - Asa Bales Park Relocation

Attached is a petition and plans for the proposed relocation of the Anna Kendall Drain, J.M. Thompson Arm. The relocation is being proposed by the Town of Westfield. The proposal is to pipe a portion of the J.M. Thompson Arm from Sta. 89+08 to Sta. 90+00, for emergency vehicular access to the Asa Bales Park.

The reconstructed drain shall consist of those lengths of pipes between the following structures as shown on sheet 2 of the plans by Westfield Public Works, dated May 17, 2006, and having job name of Asa Bales Park Storm: Starting at existing Structure 4 of the 1990 J.M. Thompson Reconstruction, which is Str. EX-1 in the new plans, then the drain continues to Str. 2. Structure 2 is a new end section that outlets into the existing open ditch. Also included is the removal of an end section, Str. 101 from the 1990 J.M. Thompson Reconstruction, which is being replaced with a manhole and extended with new pipe that connects to the new 72" RCP listed above.

The drain in total will consist of the following lengths:

72" RCP – 112 ft.

36" RCP - 16 ft.

The total length of new tile shall be 128 feet. The 92 feet of the original open drain and 20 feet of original 72" RCP will be replaced by the 112 feet of 72' RCP. This proposal will add an additional 16 feet to the Anna Kendall Drain – J.M Thompson Arm, which is the 36" RCP.

The cost of the relocation is to be paid by the Town of Westfield. Because the project is to be paid by the petitioner and is within the boundaries of the petitioner's property, the project falls under the requirements as set out in IC 36-9-27-52.5. Therefore, a hearing is not required for the petition.

The petitioner was not required to provide a performance bond since this is a Town of Westfield project.

I believe this proposed drain meets the requirements for Urban Drain Classification as set out in IC 36-9-27-67 to 69. Therefore, this drain shall be designated as an Urban Drain.

All work is to be completed within the existing easements, therefore, no new easement will be required and Non-enforcements will be filed separately when they are needed.

I recommend approval by the Board at this time.



Re: Anna Kendall: Asa Bales Park Relocation

Attached are as-builts, certificate of completion & compliance, and other information for the Asa Bales Park Relocation of the JM Thompson Arm of the Anna Kendall Drain An inspection of the drainage facilities for this section has been made and the facilities were found to be complete and acceptable.

During construction, changes were made to the drain, which will alter the plans submitted with my report for this drain-dated September 27, 2006. The report was approved by the Board at the hearing held October 23, 2006. (See Drainage Board Minutes Book 9, Pages 523-524)

The changes are as follows:

The 72" RCP was lengthened to 128 feet and the 36" RCP was shortened to 12 feet. The length of the drain due to the changes described above is now **140 feet**. The JM Thompson drain saw the removal of 20' of 72" RCP and 112 feet of open ditch. The portion removed was the drain installed as part of the 1990 improvements to the JM Thompson. Therefore, 8 feet of drain was added to the watershed's overall length.

A non-enforcement was not requested for this project and the work was done within existing easements. The project was paid for by the City of Westfield; therefore, sureties were not required for this project.

I recommend the Board approve the drain's construction as complete and acceptable.
