Re: Cool Creek Drain, Bridlewood Arm, Waterford at The Bridgewater Club Reconstruction

Attached is a petition from Throgmartin-Henke Development, L.L.P, along with plans for the proposed reconstruction and relocation of the Bridlewood Section 2 Arm of the Cool Creek Drain. The proposal is to reconstruct and relocate this drain with new pipe to allow for development of the tracts as Waterford at The Bridgewater Club.

The reconstructed drain shall consist of those lengths of pipes between the following structures as shown on sheets C203 and C204 of the plans by Stoeppelwerth & Associates, Inc., dated October 17, 2011, and having job number 56030THR-SD4:

The new drain shall begin at Str. 149, which is existing Str. 38 of the Bridlewood Section 2 Arm, and then run to Str. 150, 151, and 152, which is the outlet to Lake #1.

The drain in total will consist of the following lengths:

24" RCP – 959 ft.

The total length of new drain for this arm shall be 959 feet. The 90 feet of the original drain from Str. 38 to Str. 103, which is 65 feet of open ditch and 25 feet of 24" concrete box, shall be vacated. The structure numbers listed above are as shown on sheet 4 of the as-built plans by Evergreen Planners, Inc., dated May 10, 1988, and having job number 87-84. This proposal will add 869 feet to this arm of the drains total length.

The pond (Lake #1) located in Common Area #2 is not to be considered part of the regulated drain. Only the outlet, which is Str. 152, will be maintained as part of the regulated drain. The maintenance of the pond (Lake) will be the responsibility of the Homeowners Association. The Board will retain jurisdiction for ensuring the storage volume for which the pond was designed will be retained, thereby, allowing no fill or easement encroachments.

The cost of the reconstruction is to be paid by Throgmartin-Henke Development, LLP.

This drain was built and inspected by my office, while maintaining the existing drainage path, so the petitioner did not submit surety for this drain. Surety was submitted to the City of Westfield for the overall project.

I believe this proposed drain meets the requirements for Urban Drain Classification as set out in IC 36-9-27-67 to 69. Therefore, this drain shall be designated as an Urban Drain.

I recommend that upon approval of the above proposed drain that the Board also approve the attached non-enforcement requests. The request will be for the reduction of the regulated drain easement to those easement widths as shown on the secondary plat for Waterford at The Bridgewater Club as recorded in the office of the Hamilton County Recorder.

The easements for this drain outside of the platted area shall be 15 feet per half from the centerline of the drain, as per I.C. 36-9-27-33. This will add new easement on the following parcels:

Parcel 08-10-17-00-00-024.000 ROW of Carey Road <u>Owner</u> Throgmartin-Henke Development LLP City of Westfield

I recommend the Board set a hearing for this proposed drain for November 25, 2013.

# PETITION FOR RELOCATION AND RECONSTRUCTION

Throgmartin-Henke, L.L.P.

(hereinafter "Petitioner"),

hereby petitions the Hamilton County Drainage Board for authority to relocate and improve a

section of the Bridlewood Drain, and in support of

said petition advises the Board that:

- Petitioner owns real estate through which a portion of the Bridlewood Drain runs.
- 2. Petitioner plans to develop its real estate with roads, buildings, utilities, storm drains, sanifary sewers and other structures.
- Petitioner's proposed development of its real estate will require relocation and reconstruction of a porion of the Bridlewood Drain, as specifically shown on engineering plans and specifications filed with the Hamilton County Surveyor.
- 4. The work necessary for the proposed relocation and reconstruction will be undertaken at the sole expense of the Petitioner and such work will result in substantial improvement to the <u>Bridlewood</u> Drain, without cost to other property owners on the watershed of the <u>Bridlewood</u> Drain.
- Proposed relocation and reconstruction will not adversely affect other land owners within the drainage shed.
- Petitioner requests approval of the proposed relocation and reconstruction under IC 36-9-27-52.5.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner requests that an Order issued from the Hamilton County
Drainage Board authorizing relocation and reconstruction of the Bridlewood
Drain, in conformance with applicable law and plans and specifications on file with the Hamilton
County Surveyor.

Petitioner is the owner of all lots in the land affected by the proposed new regulated drain. The drainage will affect various lots in <u>Waterford at The Bridgewater Club</u>, Sections D4 & K3 \_\_\_\_, a subdivision in Hamilton County, Indiana. The general route of such drainage shall be in existing easements and along public roads as shown in the plans on file in the Surveyor's Office.

Petitioner believes that the cost, damages and expenses of the proposed improvement will be less than the benefits which will result to the owners of the land likely to be benefited thereby. Petitioner believes the proposed improvements will:

- (a) improve public health
- (b) benefit a public street
- (c) be of public utility

Petitioner agrees to pay the cost of construction of the drainage system and requests periodic maintenance assessments by the Board thereafter.

The Petitioner also agrees to the following:

- To provide the Drainage Board a Performance Bond or Non-Revocable Letter of Credit for the portion of the drainage system which will be made a regulated drain. The bond will be in the amount of 120% of the Engineer's estimate. The bond will be in effect until construction of 100% of the system is completed and so certified by the Engineer.
- The Petitioner shall retain an Engineer throughout the construction phase. At completion of the project the Petitioner's Engineer shall certify that the drainage system which is to be maintained as a regulated drain has been constructed as per construction plans.
- 3. The Petitioner agrees to request in writing to the County Surveyor any changes from the approved plan and must receive written authorization from the County Surveyor prior to implementation of the change. All changes shall be documented and given to the Surveyor to be placed in the Drain file.
- 4. The Petitioner shall instruct his Engineer to provide a reproducible print on a 24" x 36" Mylar of the final design of the Drainage System. This shall be submitted to the County Surveyor prior to the release of the Performance Bond.
- 5. The Petitioner shall comply with the Erosion Control Plan as specified on the construction plans. Failure to comply with the Erosion Control Plan shall be determined by the Board as being an obstruction to the drainage system. The County Surveyor shall immediately install or repair the needed measures at Petitioners cost as per IC 36-9-27-46.

The Petitioner further requests that the Drain be classified as an Urban Drain as per IC 36-9-27-69(d).

On this 25<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2013, the Hamilton County Drainage Board has held a hearing on the Maintenance Report and Schedule of Assessments of the Cool Creek Drain, Bridlewood Arm, Waterford at the Bridgewater Club Reconstruction; Structure 38 to Structure 103 (65 feet of open ditch) and 24" Concrete Box (25 feet).

The Board also received and considered the written objection of an owner of certain lands affected by the proposed Reconstruction, said owner being:

Evidence was heard on the Reconstruction Report and on the aforementioned objections.

The Board, having considered the evidence and objections, and, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did find and determine that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed Reconstruction will be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of all land benefited by the Reconstruction.

The Board having considered the evidence and objections, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did adopt the Schedule of Assessments as proposed, subject to amendment after inspection of the subject drain as it relates to the lands of any owners which may have been erroneously included or omitted from the Schedule of Assessments.

The Board further finds that it has jurisdiction of these proceedings and that all required notices have been duly given or published as required by law.

Wherefore, it is ORDERED, that the proposed Reconstruction of the Cool Creek Drain, Bridlewood Arm, Waterford at The Bridgewater Club Reconstruction be and is hereby declared established.

Thereafter, the Board made inspection for the purpose of determining whether or not the lands of any owners had been erroneously included or excluded from the Schedule of Assessments. The Board finds on the basis of the reports and findings at this hearing as follows:

# **Re: Cool Creek Drainage Area- Bridlewood Drain: The Waterford at Bridgewater Reconstruction**

Attached are as-builts, certificate of completion & compliance, and other information for The Waterford at Bridgewater Reconstruction. An inspection of the drainage facilities for this section has been made and the facilities were found to be complete and acceptable.

During construction, changes were made to the drain, which will alter the plans submitted with my report for this drain-dated October 8, 2013. The report was approved by the Board at the hearing held November 25, 2013. (See Drainage Board Minutes Book 15, Pages 263-265) The changes are as follows: the 24" RCP was shortened from 959 feet to 954 feet. The length of the drain due to the changes described above is now **954 feet**.

It should be noted that this project removed 90 feet of existing drain constructed with Bridlewood Section 2. Therefore, this project added 864 feet to the watershed's overall length. It should also be noted the portion of drain removed was never included in the construction costs associated with Bridlewood Section 2. Thus, no capital asset valuation change is needed.

The non-enforcement was approved by the Board at its meeting on November 25, 2013 and recorded under instrument #2013076078. Sureties for this project were held by the City of Westfield.

I recommend the Board approve the drain's construction as complete and acceptable.




