Re: Christian Klingensmith Arm, Mary Wilson Drain

Attached is a partial vacation request, non-enforcement request, partial relocation, plans, calculations, quantity summary and assessment roll for the Christian Klingensmith Arm, Mary Wilson Drain. I have reviewed the submittals and petition and have found each to be in proper form.

I have made a personal inspection of the land described in the petition. Upon doing so, I believe that the drain is practicable; will improve the public health; benefit a public highway and be of public utility; and that the costs, damages, and expenses of the proposed drain will probably be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of land likely to be benefited.

The portion of the existing Klingensmith Drain from sta.O to approximately sta. 16+60 (center line of existing right of way for Carey Road also known as Grassy Branch Road) along with Arm 1 will be vacated. This is being done due to the construction of the drainage facilities for the Bridgewater Club subdivision which will be maintained by the Town of Westfield. Per the 1894 drain description this will vacate 1,660 feet of main ditch and 654 feet of Arm 1 for a total vacation of 2,314 feet.

The portion of the existing Klingensmith Drain from Sta. 34+00 to approximately Sta. 16+60 has been reconstructed by the Throgmartin's.

The new drain runs from it's outlet into the Mary Wilson Drain through the pond and terminates at a structure approximately 35 feet east of the centerline of Carey Road.

This drain now consists of the following:

 Open Ditch
 540 feet
 12" HDPE
 429 feet

 24" RCP
 360 feet
 12" RCP
 55 feet

The new length of the drain is 1,384 feet. An additional 276 feet of the drain was reduced from the original description through straightening the drain.

The retention pond (lake) located on tract 08-10-18-00-00-011.000, 08-10-18-00-00-012.000 owned by W. Gerald Throgmartin and tract 08-10-18-00-00-012.001 owned by Jerry W. and Peggy S. Throgmartin is not to be considered part the of the regulated drain. Only the inlet and outlet will be maintained as part of the regulated drain. The maintenance of the pond (lake) will be the responsibility of the property owner. The Board will however, retain jurisidiction for ensuring the storage volume for which the lake was designed will be retained. Thereby, allowing no fill or easement encroachments. The Board will treat the lake as an open ditch so as to maintain continuity of the regulated drain.

I have reviewed the plans and believe the drain will not benefit each tract equally. Therefore, I recommend each lot be assessed as follows:

- 1. Maintenance assessment for roads and streets shall be set at \$10.00 per acre.
- 2. Maintenance assessment for agricultural tracts and non-platted residential tracts shall be \$5.00 per acre with a minimum of \$25.00.
- 3. Maintenance assessment for platted lots and common areas in subdivisions whose drainage systems will not be part of the regulated drain shall be set a \$5.00 per acre with a \$35.00 minimum.
- 4. Maintenance assessment for platted lots and common areas in subdivisions whose drainage systems will be part of the regulated drain shall be set at \$10.00 per acre with a \$65.00 minimum.
- 5. Maintenance assessment for commercial, multi-family residential, and institutional tracts shall be set at \$10.00 per acre with a \$50.00 minimum.

This will create an annual maintenance assessment of \$974.32.

The cost of the above relocation/reconstruction was paid for by the Throgmartin's. No further reconstruction costs will be assessed to landowners within the drainage shed as part of this proposal.

Parcels assessed for this drain may be assessed for the Mary Wilson, Wheeler-Beals or Cool Creek Drain at sometime in the future.

I believe this proposed drain meets the requirements for Urban Drain Classification as set out in IC 36-9-27-67 to 69. Therefore, this drain shall be designated as an Urban Drain.

I recommend the Board set a hearing for this proposed drain for January 27, 2003.
