Re: Cool Creek Drainage Area, Springmill Villages #268 Arm

Upon review of the Cool Creek Drain, I believe that the Springmill Villages Drain should be made an arm to the Cool Creek Drain, as the Springmill Villages Drain is a tributary to the Cool Creek Drain. This would also avoid a double assessment on the tracts currently assessed for the Springmill Villages Drain when the remainder of the Cool Creek Drain is assessed for maintenance.

The Springmill Villages Drain was created by the Hamilton County Drainage Board per the Surveyor's report dated May 17, 1994 and approved by the Board on July 25, 1994 (See Drainage Board Minutes Book 3, Pages 265 to 266). At present the Springmill Villages Drain maintenance assessment affects 191.43 acres and 555 lots. The rate of assessment for the drain is set at \$5.00 per acre for common areas and road, with a \$30.00 minimum, and \$30.00 per lot. This rate collects \$18,403.10 annually and the balance within the fund is \$77,049.08. There are no outstanding work orders for this drain at this time.

The current maintenance assessments, as per the existing rates set for the Cool Creek Drain are as follows:

- 1. Maintenance assessment for roads and streets are set at \$10.00 per acre with a \$25.00 minimum.
- 2. Maintenance assessment for agricultural tracts are set at \$2.00 per acre with a \$15.00 minimum.

- 3. Maintenance assessment for non-platted residential tracts are set at \$2.00 per acre with a \$15.00 minimum.
- 4. Maintenance assessment for commercial, institutional and multi-family residential tracts are set at \$35.00 per acre with a \$75.00 minimum.
- 5. Maintenance assessment for platted lots in subdivisions whose drainage systems will not be part of the regulated drain shall be set at \$25.00 per lot/minimum. Common areas within non-regulated drain subdivisions shall be assessed at \$10.00 per acre with a \$25.00 minimum.
- 6. Maintenance assessment for platted lots within subdivisions whose drainage system will be part of the regulated drain shall be set at \$65.00 per lot/minimum. Common areas within the regulated drain subdivisions shall be set at \$15.00 per acre with a \$65.00 minimum.

The total annual assessment for this arm will be \$39,904.76.

The current balance of the Springmill Villages Drain shall be kept separate and these funds expended for needed maintenance on the Springmill Villages Drain. This shall be done until the funds are exhausted. At that time funding for repairs shall then be taken from the Cool Creek Drain fund.

Future assessments for the drainage area of the Springmill Villages Drain will be made into the Cool-Creek Drain fund. No further maintenance collections for the Springmill Villages Drain shall be made after 2010 other than any delinquent assessment penalties and interest which remain unpaid.

I recommend that the Board set a hearing for this consolidation for October 25, 2010.

#### Dear Sirs:

I am in receipt of your notice regarding the Cool Creek Drainage Area, Springville Villages Arm. In your notice you note the current assessment is \$30/year for the Springmill Villages Drain and the proposed assessment for the Cool Creek Drain is \$65/year.

With so many jurisdictions across our country coming under heavy scrutiny for taxation and spending far beyond expectations, such notices with (about) 120% increases raise serious concerns. While the overall increase is not that significant, I simply do not support a 120% increase in any form of taxation.

While I am certainly not a drainage expert, an annual fee of \$39,904.76 along with a 120% increase seems quite exorbitant. Without further substantiation presented with your notice, I cannot support such increases. My letter is, therefore, submitted to you, opposing your proposed increase.

To whom it may concern:

SECRETARY I am writing to make known to the Hamilton County Drainage Board my objection of Mr. Kenton Ward's assessment and subsequent recommendation (dated 29 June 2010) for the Cool Creek Drainage Area, Springmill Villages Arm (was #268).

The notice of hearing provided to home owners by mail does not provide any justification for the recommendation. Further review of Mr. Ward's letter to the Hamilton County Drainage Board (dated 29 June 2010), found by following the link (<a href="www.hamiltoncounty.in.gov/drainageboardnotices">www.hamiltoncounty.in.gov/drainageboardnotices</a>) provided in the mailed notice, did not reveal any additional justification. As such, it is impossible to support a decision to increase the assessment for home owners within the area identified by more than 100%. Such an increase (>100%) in any other area of life would automatically be considered excessive without second thought. No evidence of quotations or historical data for periodic maintenance of the entire drain has been provided to change this.

Ignoring the cost, the logic behind the recommendation is still not clear. Per Mr. Ward's letter, the Springmill Villages Drain is currently a tributary to the Cool Creek Drain and yet the cost for the Cool Creek Drain does not appear to have been passed to the inhabitants of the Springmill Villages Drain area to date. No explanation has been provided to define what will change to make the Springmill Villages Drain an Arm to the Cool Creek Drain instead of a tributary. Is this a matter of semantics or of actual civil infrastructure? In either case, there is no reasoning provided for why the current scenario should change.

Additionally, the current balance for the Springmill Villages Drain is more than four times (4x) the annual rate-required. Why is such a large-balance-necessary?—It is stated in Mr. Ward's letter that this balance will not be carried forward for use with the Cool Creek Drain, but will be kept separate for use of the Springmill Villages Drain until the funds are exhausted. However, it also states that no additional funds will be assessed into the Springmill Villages Drain after 2010 and that when the current balance is subsequently exhausted, that funds will be taken from the Cool Creek Drain. At that point in time, future assessments for the Springmill Villages Drain shall be made into the Cool Creek Drain fund. It is not clear if the rates will increase further at that time or not.

Without additional information for proper explanation and justification, my objection will remain.
