You are hereby notified that the undersigned, Ernest J. Ellingwood and Bessie E. Ellingwood,  
 et al, have filed their petition in the Circuit Court of Madison County, Indiana, and that  
 the same is now pending therein, praying for the reconstruction of an open and tile drain  
 along and over the following described route, to-wit:

Beginning at a point in the northeast corner of the southwest  
 quarter of the northeast quarter of Section 14, Township 18 North,  
 Range 6 East, and running in a southwesterly direction over and across  
 the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter of Section 14, Twp. 18  
 North, Range 6 East, and continuing on in a southwesterly direction  
 over and across the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter of  
 Section 14, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East to a point where it crosses  
 a county highway, being in the northwest corner of the southwest  
 quarter of Section 14, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East, where it makes an  
 angle to the west over and across for a distance of approximately  
 10 rods, then angling back to the southwest over and across the  
 center portion of the Southeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of  
 Section 15, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East, until it reaches a point in  
 the southeast corner of the southwest quarter of Section 15, Twp. 18  
 North, Range 6 East, where again it crosses a county road running in a  
 northerly and southerly direction until it reaches a point in the  
 northeast corner of the southeast quarter of the northwest quarter of  
 Section 22, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East, where it again makes an  
 angle to the right and runs in a more westerly than southerly direction  
 over and across the middle portion of the south half of the northwest  
 quarter of Section 22, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East, to a point where it  
 crosses State Road 13, then bearing to the left in a more southerly than  
 westerly direction over and across the southeast corner of the northeast  
 quarter of Section 21, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East, and over and across  
 the northeast corner of the northeast quarter of the southeast quarter  
 of Section 21, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East, and continues on in a  
 southwesterly direction over and across a corner of the south half of the  
 northwest quarter of the southeast quarter of Section 21, Twp. 18 North,  
 Range 6 East, and also over the northwest corner of the southwest  
 quarter of the southeast quarter of Section 21, Twp. 18 North, Range 6  
 East to a point approximately a quarter of a mile (1/4) north of the  
 section line where it bears more to the west than to the south and crosses  
 over and across the south half of the southwest quarter of Section 21,  
 Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East, to a point approximately 500 feet north of  
 the southwest corner of Section 21, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East, where it  
 bears to the right in a more westerly than southerly direction and crosses  
 the county line between the counties of Madison and Hamilton, entering  
 said Hamilton County in the northeast corner of the northeast quarter of  
 Section 29, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East, and running thence in a south-  
 westerly direction over and across said quarter section to a point  
 approximately 1/4 mile north of the north and south center lines of said  
 Section 29, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East, where it bears more to the west  
 than to the south and continues on over and across the center portion  
 of the south half of the northwest quarter of Section 29, Twp. 18 North,  
 Range 6 East to a point where said drain reaches a north and south high-  
 way, where said reconstruction shall stop, being a point northeast of  
 what is known as the Cytheanne Church.

TRIBUTARY ONE:

Commencing at a point in the southwest corner of the northeast quarter of the southwest quarter of Section 11, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East, and running thence in a southwesterly direction over and across the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter of Section 11, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East, and also across the northwest corner of the northwest quarter of Section 14, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East, crossing what is known as State Road 13, and bearing on in a southwesterly direction over and across a county highway and continuing on in a southwesterly direction over and across the north portion of the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter of Section 15, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East, to a point in the center of said quarter section line approximately 1/4 of a mile north of the east and west center section line of Section 15, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East, where it bears to the south more than to the west, running over and across the southerly portion of the southeast corner of the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter of Section 15, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East, bearing on in a southerly direction over and across the east half (1/2) of the northwest quarter of the southwest quarter of Section 15, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East, to a point where it reaches the main ditch, all of said tributary being of tile construction.

TRIBUTARY TWO:

Commencing at a point approximately 1/4 mile south of the northwest corner of the northwest quarter of Section 13, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East, and running thence in a southwesterly direction over and across the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter of Section 14, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East, and continuing on in a southwesterly direction over and across the northeast quarter of the southeast quarter of Section 14, Township 18 North, Range 6 East to a point approximately in the center of said quarter section where it bears to the west more than to the south and crosses over and across the west half (1/2) of the southeast quarter and the east half (1/2) of the southwest quarter of Section 14, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East to a point in the Extreme northwest corner of the southeast quarter of the southwest quarter of Section 14, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East on the land owned by Clinton C. Jenkins, where said ditch bears to the south more than to the west and continues on in a southwesterly direction over and across the south half (1/2) of the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter of Section 14, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East, crossing a county road and bearing on in a more southerly than westerly direction across the northwest quarter of the northwest quarter of Section 23, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East to a point approximately (1/16) one sixteenth of a mile west of the quarter section line of Section 23, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East, where said drain bears to the west more than to the south crossing said highway and continuing over and across the south half (1/2) of the northeast quarter of Section 22, Twp. 18 North, Range 6 East to a point where it enters into the main ditch, all of said tributary being of tile construction.

Slater Bridge
