Re: Home Place Drain, College Meadows Arm

Attached is a drain map and petition, filed January 5, 2004 by twenty-one (21) property owners, to regulate the existing storm sewer infrastructure in College Meadows subdivision as the College Meadows Arm of the Home Place Drain. This proposed drain is located in Clay Township.

I have made a personal inspection of the land described below. Upon doing so, I believe that the drain is practicable, will improve the public health, benefit a public highway and be of public utility and that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed drain will probably be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of land likely to be benefited. The drain will consist of the following:

6" Concrete Tile	10 ft.	15" Concrete Tile	899 ft.

The total length of the drain will be 4,418 feet.

The current maintenance assessments, as per the existing rates set for the Home Place Drain are as follows:

- 1. Maintenance assessment for roads and streets are set at \$10.00 per acre.
- 2. Maintenance assessment for agricultural tracts are set at \$5.00 per acre with a \$15.00 minimum.
- 3. Maintenance assessment for non-platted residential tracts are set at \$5.00 per acre with a \$15.00 minimum.

- 4. Maintenance assessment for commercial, institutional and multi-family residential tracts are set at \$10.00 per acre with a \$75.00 minimum.
- 5. Maintenance assessment for platted lots in subdivisions whose drainage systems will not be part of the regulated drain shall be set at \$35.00 per lot/minimum. Common areas within non-regulated drain subdivisions shall be assessed at \$5.00 per acre with a \$35.00 minimum.
- 6. Maintenance assessment for platted lots within subdivisions whose drainage system will be part of the regulated drain shall be set at \$65.00 per lot/minimum. Common areas within the regulated drain subdivisions shall be set at \$10.00 per acre with a \$65.00 minimum.

Since the College Meadows area is already assessed to the Home Place Drain, there will be no increase in the maintenance assessment for this arm.

I believe this proposed drain meets the requirements for Urban Drain Classification as set out in IC 36-9-27-67 to 69. Therefore, this drain shall be designated as an Urban Drain.

The easements per the plats for College Meadows Sections 1, 2, and 3, as recorded in the Office of the Hamilton County Recorder, do not meet the minimum requirements for a tile drain as set out in IC 36-9-27-33. Most of the tile runs along or just outside of the right of way line for the roads, so a 20 foot front yard easement will be placed along the affected lots on Carrollton Avenue and Chevy Chase Lane. This will affect lots 25, 27, 28, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, 43, 44, 45, 46, 71, 72, 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, 78, and 79. The easement for the tile that traverses between lots will need to be 15' from each side of the center line of the tile and will affect lots 2, 3, 32, 33, 36, 37, 38, 39, 75, 76, 77, 78, 79, 80, 81, 82, 83, and 84. Since the tile is already in place and within existing easement or building setback area, I believe that no damages will result to landowners by the regulating of this drain.


