Re: Elijah Jay Drainage Area

Attached is a drain map, drainage shed map and schedule of assessments for maintenance for the Elijah Jay Drainage Area. This drain is located in Adams Township. The drainage area has a drainage shed of 3,111.02 acres.

The Elijah Jay Drainage Area shall consist of six (6) separate regulated drains. Those drains are the Walker Darnell; George Stephens; J.C. Ringer; Margaret Cade; Kercheval & Reagan; and Elijah Jay.

The Kercheval & Reagan Drain consists of two drains, the John Reagan Drain and the J.C. Kercheval Drain. The John Reagan Drain was constructed by order of the Hamilton County Commissioners on January 7, 1899. The drain consists of 2,490 feet of the tile drain. The J.C. Kercheval Drain was constructed by order of the Hamilton County Commissioners on October 7, 1908. The drain consists of 2,629 feet of tile drain.

The Elijah Jay Drain consists of two drains the John Boatman Drain and the Elijah Jay Drain. The John Boatman Drain was constructed by order of the Hamilton County Commissioners on September 1879. The drain consists of 3,097 feet of tile drain. The Elijah Jay Drain was constructed by order of the Hamilton County Circuit Court on February 8, 1892. The drain consists of 800 feet of the drain and 15, 288 feet of open ditch.

The Walker Darnell Drain was constructed by order of the Hamilton County Drainage Board October 2, 1967. The drain consists of 3,440 feet of the drain.

The Margaret Cade Drain consists of two drains, the Margaret Cade Drain and the E.E. Ponsler Drain. The Margaret Cade Drain was constructed by order of the Hamilton County Circuit Court on December 2, 1884. The drain consists of 7,309 feet of open ditch. The E.E. Ponsler Drain was constructed by order of the Hamilton County Circuit Court in April 1916. The drain consists of 2,762 feet of tile drain.

The J.C. Ringer Drain was constructed by order of the Hamilton County Commissioners on January 30, 1903. The drain consists of 5,864 feet of tile drain.

The George Stephens was constructed by order of the Hamilton County Commissioners October 25, 1897. The drain consists of 2,945 feet of tile drain.

The drainage area shall consist of the following length.

At this time the Elijah Jay Drainage Area is listed on the 2011 Classification List for maintenance at Number 4. The office has had one (1) complaint on the drain since 2004. That complaint is as follows:

I am recommending that the Elijah Jay Drain Drainage Area be placed on maintenance at this time. The nature of maintenance work required is as follows:

- A. Clearing of trees and brush on the existing open drain as needed to improve flow;
- B. Creation and re-excavation of silt basins;
- C. Re-excavation of open ditch to original grade line;
- D. Surface water structures as might be required;
- E. Bank erosion protection and/or seeding as might be required;
- F. Repair of private tile outlet ends as might be required;

- G. Repair of regulated drain tiles & outlets;
- H. Removal of beaver dams;
- I. Removal of debris and/or blockage from regulated open ditch;
- J. Spraying for vegetation control;
- K. Mowing filter strips;
- L. Any other repairs deemed to be applicable and necessary by the Surveyor to restore the drain to its original intended use and condition.

The frequency with which maintenance work should be performed is annually as required by the condition of the drain.

The Walker Darnell Drain #4 was placed on maintenance by the Board at hearing on October 2, 1967 (See Hamilton County Drainage Board Minute Book 1, Page 121). The original rate for the drain was \$0.50 per acre with a \$3.00 minimum. On June 26, 2006 the Hamilton County Drainage Board had a hearing to increase the rates. Agricultural and unplatted residential were set at \$5.00 per acre with a \$15.00 minimum, unregulated platted lots set at \$5.00 per acre with a \$35.00 minimum, regulated platted lots set at \$10.00 per acre with a \$65.00 minimum, commercial, institutional and multi-family were set at \$10.00 per acre with a \$75.00 minimum and roads \$10.00 per acre (See Hamilton County Drainage Board Minutes Book 9, Pages 268 to 269).

The current rate for the Walker Darnell collects an annual assessment of \$799.88. At this time the drain has a current balance of \$2.369.56.

The George Stephens Drain #39 was placed on maintenance by the Board at hearing on April 5, 1971. (See Hamilton County Drainage Board Minute Book 1, Page 67). The original rate for the drain was \$1.00 per acre with a \$3.00 minimum. On November 28, 2005 the Hamilton County Drainage Board increased the rate to \$5.00 per acre with a \$10.00 minimum for non-platted residential tracts and agricultural tracts; \$5.00 per acre with a\$35.00 minimum for platted lots in subdivisions whose drainage systems will not be part of the regulated drain; \$10.00 per acre with a \$65.00 minimum for lots within subdivisions whose drainage systems will be part of the regulated drain; \$10.00 per acre with a \$75.00 minimum for commercial and multifamily tracts; and \$10.00 per acre for roads and streets. (See Hamilton County Drainage Board Minutes Book 8, Page 509-511).

The current rate for the George Stephens Drain collects an annual assessment of \$1,145.32. At this time the drain has current balance of \$3,465.23.

The J.C. Ringer #40 was placed on maintenance by the Board at hearing on April 5, 1971. (See Hamilton County Drainage Board Minute Book 1, Page 67). On June 6, 2006 the Hamilton County Drainage Board had a hearing to increase the rates. Agricultural and unplatted residential were set at \$1.00 per acre with a \$15.00 minimum, unregulated platted lots set at \$5.00 per acre with a \$35.00 minimum, regulated platted lots set at \$10.00 per acre with a \$65.00 minimum, commercial, institutional and multi-family were set at \$10.00 per acre with a \$75.00 minimum and roads \$10.00 per acre (See Hamilton County Drainage Board Minutes Book 9, Pages 274).

The current rate for the J.C. Ringer Drain collects an annual assessment of \$1,280.96. At this time the drain has a current balance of \$4,251.07.

The Margaret Cade Drain #97 was placed on maintenance by the Board at hearing on July 17, 1978. (See Hamilton County Drainage Board Minute Book 1, Page 268-269). The original rate for the drain was \$1.50 per acre with a \$3.00 minimum. On August 28, 2006 the Hamilton County Drainage Board had a hearing to increase the rate to \$1.50 per acre with a \$15.00 minimum for non-platted residential tracts and agricultural tracts; \$5.00 per acre with a \$35.00 minimum for platted lots in subdivision whose drainage systems will not be part of the regulated drain; \$10.00 per acre with a \$65.00 minimum for lots within subdivision whose drainage systems will be part of the regulated drain; \$10.00 per acre with a \$75.00 minimum for commercial and multi-family tracts; and 10.00 per acres for roads and streets. (See Hamilton County Drainage Board Minutes Book 9, Page 387).

The current rate for the Margaret Cade Drain collects an annual assessment of \$2,624.88. At this time the drain has a current balance of \$18,662.92.

The Kercheval & Reagan Drain #167 was placed on maintenance by the Board at hearing on April 14,1983. (See Hamilton County Drainage Board Minute Book 1, Page 526). On June 6, 2006 the Hamilton County Drainage Board had a hearing to increase the rates. Agricultural and unplatted residential were set at \$3.00 per acre with a \$15.00 minimum, unregulated platted lots set at \$5.00 per acre with a \$35.00 minimum, regulated platted lots set at \$10.00 per acre with a \$65.00 minimum, commercial, institutional and multi-family were set at \$10.00 per acre with a \$75.00 minimum and roads \$10.00 per acre (See Hamilton County Drainage Board Minutes Book 9, Pages 232).

The current rate for the Kercheval & Reagan Drain collects an annual assessment of \$740.04. At this time the drain has a current balance of \$50.90.

At this time five (5) drains are currently on a maintenance program. Those drains are the Kercheval & Reagan Drain #167, Walker Darnell Drain #4, Margaret Cade #97, George Stephens Drain #39 and the J.C. Ringer #40. The balances in these drain funds will remain and be expended on those drains until the balance for that drain is exhausted. Afterwards, the cost of repair for that drain will be taken from the overall maintenance fund. For the Elijah Jay Drainage Area this will eliminate the need for double assessing those landowners already paying maintenance on the individual drains listed above.

I have reviewed the plans and drain map and upon considering each tract individually believe that all tracts within the drainage shed of the Elijah Jay Drainage Area will benefit. Upon considering the various methods of determining benefits as set out in IC 36-9-27-112, I recommend that the following maintenance assessment should be adopted by the Board:

- 1. Maintenance assessment for agricultural tracts be set at \$5.00 per acre with a \$15.00 minimum.
- 2. Maintenance assessment for non-platted residential tracts be set at \$5.00 per acre with a \$15.00 minimum.
- 3. Maintenance assessment for commercial institutional and multi-family residential tracts be set at \$10.00 per acre with a \$75.00 minimum.
- 4. Maintenance assessment for platted lots in subdivisions whose drainage systems will not be considered part of the regulated drain shall be set at \$35.00 per lot \$35.00 minimum. Common areas within subdivisions whose drainage systems will not be part of the regulated drain shall be set at \$5.00 per acre with a \$35.00 minimum.
- 5. Maintenance assessments for platted lots within a subdivision whose drainage system will be part of the regulated drain shall be set at \$65.00 per lot with a \$65.00 minimum. Common areas with regulated drain subdivisions shall be set at \$10.00 per acre with a \$65.00 minimum.
- 6. Maintenance assessment for roads and streets be set at \$10.00 per acre.

The annual maintenance collection for this drainage area will be \$17,555.48. The period of collection shall be eight years as per IC 36-9-27-43.

This drain may be assessed for maintenance for the Little Cicero Creek drain at some time in the future.

The Elijah Jay Drain, which is listed in the NPDES Phase II General Permit Application, Storm Water Quality Management Plan Part B: Baseline Characterization Report on pages 14 and 16 as being on the IDEM 305 (b) report as fully supportive of aquatic life and for full body contact.

The Elijah Jay Drain is listed in the NPDES Phase II General Permit Application Storm Water Quality Management Plan Part C: Program Implementation Report on page 5 as an MS4 Area Receiving Stream.

The Elijah Jay Drain is included in a Watershed Management Plan for Little Cicero Creek dated February 1, 2007. This plan is a water quality assessment prepared by J.F. New & Associates and Schneider Corporation. The plan was funded by a 319 grant through IDEM. The Elijah Jay Drain is not specifically identified in the report under final goals and objectives. The report refers to these items in general for the entire watershed from page 87 to page 115 in the report.

Per my 2011 Drain Classification dated February 15, 2011, this drain is listed as a drain which needs to be extended at some time in the future from its current terminus at 246th Street, north to the George Symonds Drain.

Upon review of the FEMA FIRM's for Hamilton County which became effective February 19, 2003 it was found that the Elijah Jay and Margaret Cade Drains are shown in an unstudied Zone A Flood Plain. This is shown on map numbers 18057C0025F and 18057C0110F.

I recommend that the Board set a hearing for this proposed maintenance for November 28, 2011.

I received your objection dated November 4, 2011 regarding the Elijah Jay Drainage Area. Allow me this opportunity to explain why such a large increase in your assessment.

Presently you are assessed to the J.C. Ringer Drain. Your assessment to the Ringer Drain is for one (1) acre benefited and your assessment is the \$15.00 minimum assessment for that drain. The proposed assessment for the Elijah Jay Drainage Area is for your entire 40 acre tract being benefited at the \$5.00 per acre agricultural rate for a \$200.00 total annual assessment.

A \$5.00 agricultural rate does sound high until you consider the length of drain being maintained. Presently the six (6) drains within the drainage area under maintenance consists of 27,439 feet of drain. The total collections for these drains amount to \$11,881.10 annually. This breaks down to \$2.31 per foot. Under the proposed drainage area the total length of drain increases to 46,624 feet. With an annual assessment of \$17,555.48 the price per foot is \$2.66. Knowing the poor condition of the Jay Drain the additional \$0.35 per foot is more than needed.

I hope this helps explain the reason for the large jump in annual maintenance under this proposal.

I am receipt of your objection to the above referenced hearing dated November 16, 2011. Upon reading the objection I'm at a loss as to what you may be referring to. Upon a check of the maintenance record back to 2001 I find only five (5) work orders requested on the Kercheval-Reagan Drain. Only one (1) of these was requested by you. That work was requested on July 28, 2004. It was inspected after crops were out of the field on October 4, 2004 and work completed by removal of tree roots from the tile on March 31, 2005. The other four (4) were requested and complied on tracts east of Six Points Road.

Please keep in mind that the repairs must be requested by the landowners when needed. With over 1,200 miles of regulated drain it is impossible for my staff to inspect the entire system on any regular basis.

I'm not sure what section of the drain you unclogged on your property. You are correct in that many of the ditches were originally installed by the private landowners. These are classified as private or mutual drains and there are far more miles of these throughout the county than there are regulated drains. However, the regulated drains were constructed by the Commissioners Court or Circuit Court of the County prior to 1965 or the Drainage Board since 1965. These drains act as the main outlet for the private or mutual drains.
