RE: Kakasuleff Drain

Attached is a petition, drain map, drainage shed map and schedule of assessments for the proposed Kakasuleff Drain. The petition was filed by Gerald Kakasuleff on October 22, 2010. This proposed drain is located in Jackson Township.

The proposed drain will intercept both the upper portions of the Clara Gintert Drain and the William Shyrock Drain. The drain will begin at a point 152 feet south of the south east corner of Section 30, Township 20 North, Range 5 East. Said point is at or near Station 10+50 if Arm 1 of the Clara Gintert Drain per the Viewers Report to the Hamilton County Commissioners dated November 2, 1900. The drain thence runs in a southerly and westerly direction to its intersection with the William Shyrock Drain at a point 614 feet south and 868 feet west of the above described section corner. This point is at or near Station 26+00 of the John Hartzler Drain, an arm to the William Shyrock Drain per the Viewer Report to the Hamilton County Commissioners dated November 14, 1891. The drain thence runs west, crossing under Crooked Creek Road and terminating 655 feet south and 1981 feet west of the above described section corner. The length of the drain is 2,193 feet.

The drain consists of the following lengths:

18" Double Wall Plastic Tile	2,109 feet
18" RCP	64 feet
21" CMP	20 feet

The Kakasuleff Drain shall consist of the above described drain plus the upper sections of the Arm 1 of the Clara Gintert Drain and the John Hartzler Arm of the William Shyrock Drain. This would be from Station 0 to Station 10+50 of the Arm 1 of the Clara Gintert Drain and Station 0 to Station 21+75 of the Joseph Bright Arm (per its 1907 description) of the Clara Gintert Drain. Also, Station 0 to Station 26+00 of the John Hartzler Arm of the William Shyrock. The total lengths are as follows:

Kakasuleff	2,193 feet
Arm 1 Clara Gintert	1,050 feet
John Hartzler Arm, Wm Shyrock	2,600 feet
Joseph Bright Arm, Clara Gintert	2,175 feet
Total Length	8,018 feet

The Kakasuleff Drain is currently in place having been constructed at the petitioner's expense. Therefore there is no cost for construction. I believe that no damages will result to landowners by the construction of this drain. Therefore, damages for all tracts shall be set at \$0.00.

I have reviewed the plans and drain map and believe as set out in IC36-9-27-69, that all tracts within the drainage shed of this portion of the Kakasuleff Drain currently being constructed will benefit. I recommend the maintenance assessment rates be set as follows:

- 1. Maintenance assessment for roads and streets are set at \$10.00 per acre.
- 2. Maintenance assessment for agricultural tracts be set at \$5.00 per acre with a \$15.00 minimum.
- 3. Maintenance assessment for non-platted residential tracts be set at \$5.00 per acre with a \$15.00 minimum.
- 4. Maintenance assessment for commercial, institutional and multi-family residential tracts are set at \$10.00 per acre with a \$75.00 minimum.

- 5. Maintenance assessment for platted lots in subdivisions whose drainage systems will not be part of the regulated drain shall be set at \$5.00 per acre, with a \$35.00 minimum. Common areas within subdivisions whose drainage systems will not be part of the regulated drain shall be assessed at \$5.00 per acre with a \$35.00 minimum.
- 6. Maintenance assessment for platted lots within subdivisions whose drainage system will be part of the regulated drain shall be set at \$10.00 per acre, with a \$65.00 minimum. Common areas within the regulated drain subdivisions shall be set at \$10.00 per acre with a \$65.00 minimum.

The annual collection for this drain shall be \$845.92.

NAME

Although the Kakasuleff Drain is new construction, the portions of the drain which were part of the Gintert and Shyrock are quite a bit older. (120 years and 104 years for Gintert and 111 years for Shyrock). Because of this and the low annual assessment I recommend that the period of collections be set at eight (8) years as per IC 36-9-27-43.

The construction of this drain places regulated drainage new easements on the following tracts:

I recommend that the easement be established at fifteen (15) feet as measures at right angles from the centerline of the tile for a total of thirty (30) feet as per IC-36-9-27-33(e).

Upon approval of the petition report by the Board the following benefited acres shall be removed from the current assessments for the Gintert and Shyrock Drains.

# **Drainage Access Agreement**

THIS AGREEMENT dated as of November 15, 2010 between Gerald Kakasuleff of 9711 246st Street E Cicero IN 46034 (the "Kakasuleff Farms") and Michael W. Klinger of 24420 Crooked Creek Road Cicero IN 460364 ("Klinger")

#### WHEREAS:

(A)

The Klinger is the registered owner of the property legally described as 03-03-31-00-00-004.004.000 (the "Klinger Property");

(B)

The Kakasuleff Farms wishes to obtain access over a portion of the Klinger's Property for the purposes of obtaining an outlet for a tile drainage with the absolute understanding that no easement rights exist and further can't assert easement rights at any point in the future;

(C)

Both parties agree that this agree is for the sole purpose of installing and then maintaining a Private drain as defined under Indiana Code 36-9-27-2 "Private drain" means a drain that: (1) is located on land owned by one (1) person or by two (2) or more persons jointly; and (2) was not established under or made subject to any drainage statute. Further, this agreement is null and void if this provision is violated unless consent provided by Klinger;

NOW THEREFORE in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions hereinafter set forth and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

Klinger and Kakasuleff Farms, do hereby agree that the work shall be constructed, repaired and maintained according to the following

**Description of Drainage Works** 

- 1. The drainage system crosses into the Klinger property approximately 80 feet north of the drive associated with 24420 Crooked Creek Road Cicero IN 46034. The tile will begin below ground surface and become exposed after approximately 50 feet.
- The drain on the Klinger property shall be constructed of 18" tile approximately 8' below the ground surface. The outlet shall be of corrugated metal pipe with a rodent grate.
- 3. Beyond the pipe outlet will be sufficient materials to ensure the elimination of erosion.
- 4. Construction will be restricted to an area no larger than 15 feet either side of the tile.

#### Construction

- 1. Kakasuleff Farms, its agents, employees and workmen may enter on and may construct the drain on the Klinger property within six months of the date of agreement.
- 2. Klinger shall not be liable for any damages to the drain caused by Klinger provided that Klinger exercises reasonable care.
- 3. Kakasuleff Farms will be responsible for removal of any materials deemed necessary by Klinger during construction which would include, but not be limited to, tree stumps.
- The Kakasuleff Farms agrees to repair any damage caused to the Klinger's Property as a result of such access and the Kakasuleff Farms will restore the accessed area to its original condition, if requested by Klinger, within 30 days of Klinger's request.

#### Maintenance

- 1. Klinger shall not be responsible for maintaining the ditch.
- 2. Kakasuleff Farms accepts sole responsibility for the maintenance, repairs, as well as any other ongoing or onetime costs related to the drain.
- 3. On reasonable notice in writing to Klinger, Kakasuleff Farms may have reasonable access to the property to repair or maintain the drain.

#### Costs

- 1. The entire cost of the construction, repair and maintenance of the drain shall be borne and paid by Kakasuleff Farms.
- 2. This agreement herein contained when executed by the Parties hereto, if required by statute, shall be registered in the proper Registry Office and any costs shall be borne by the Kakasuleff Farms.

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- The Kakasuleff Farms are solely responsible ensuring that all local, state, and federal guidelines are met during construction as well as in the future related to this drain.
  - 4. The Kakasuleff Farms have the sole responsibility for any current or future assessments for the maintenance of this drain.

Klinger accepts no responsibility whatsoever for any losses or damages (personal or property) which the Kakasuleff Farms suffers or incurs as a result of accessing Klinger's Property, and the Kakasuleff Farms hereby agrees to indemnify Klinger against any losses suffered by Kakasuleff Farms or claims made against Klinger by the Kakasuleff Farms' agents, servants, invitees and others who access Klinger's Property pursuant to the rights given to the Kakasuleff Farms under this Agreement.

3. This Agreement shall endure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties hereto and their respective heirs, administrators, executors, successors and assigns.

Any differences between the Kakasuleff Farms and Klinger as to their rights and obligations under this agreement that are not settled by mutual agreement shall be submitted to an arbitrator or other such person who has authority to make a final decision.

The Board, having considered the evidence and objections, and, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did find and determine that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed Reconstruction will be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of all land benefited by the Reconstruction.

The Board having considered the evidence and objections, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did adopt the Schedule of Assessments as proposed, subject to amendment after inspection of the subject drain as it relates to the lands of any owners which may have been erroneously included or omitted from the Schedule of Assessments.

The Board further finds that it has jurisdiction of these proceedings and that all required notices have been duly given or published as required by law.

Wherefore, it is ORDERED, that the proposed Reconstruction of the Kakasuleff Drain be and is hereby declared established.

Thereafter, the Board made inspection for the purpose of determining whether or not the lands of any owners had been erroneously included or excluded from the Schedule of Assessments. The Board finds on the basis of the reports and findings at this hearing as follows:


The Board issued an order declaring the proposed improvement established. Such findings and order were marked filed and are available for inspection in the Office of the Hamilton County Surveyor.

Re: Kakasuleff Drain

Attached are the GPS locations and other information for the Kakasuleff Drain. An inspection of the drainage facilities for this section has been made and the facilities were found to be complete and acceptable.

During construction, changes were made to the drain, which will alter the plans submitted with my report for this drain-dated February 11, 2011. The report was approved by the Board at the hearing held March 30, 2011. The changes are as follows:

The upper section of the Clara Gintert Arm 1 was tied into the Kakasuleff drain at Station 11+13. The John Hartzler arm to the Wm Shryock was intercepted at Station 27+14. The Kakasuleff Drain consists of the Kakasuleff tile -2193 ft, a portion of the Clara Gintert Arm 1-1113 feet, Joseph Bright Arm of Clara Gintert -2175 feet, and a portion of the John Hartzler Arm to Wm Shryock -2714 feet. The length of the drain due to the changes described above is now 8,195 feet.

The easement was established for the newly constructed Kakasuleff tile at 15 feet as measures at right angles from the centerline of the tile for a total of 30 feet. The cost of the tile was paid for by the petitioner, therefore no sureties were required.

I recommend the Board approve the drain's construction as complete and acceptable.
