On February 23, 1983 a petition was filed by John Davis and Darrell Reynolds requesting an extention of the Wm. Knight Drain. The requested extention consists of an 8 and 10 inch tile installed last year. The extention begins at a breather 1400 feet North and 250 feet West of the SW corner of 11-18-3, thence running East 450 feet, thence North and East 1400 feet, thence East 200 feet entering the existing regulated drain at approximately Sta O, being approximately 2050 feet in length. The drain consists of 700 feet of 10" tile and 1350 feet of 8" tile. The only change in the existing drainage shed would be as follows:

09-19-00-00-018, 37.8 acres, increase from 3.0 acres at \$6.00 to 7.0 acres at \$14.00.

09-10-00-00-019, 0.68 acres, add 0.3 acres at \$3.00.

9-11-00-00-019, 54.3 acres, increase from 33.0 acres at \$66.00 to 38.0 acres at \$76.00.

The drainage shed for the Overman Harvey Drain also would be changed on Mr. Reynolds property as follows:

11-00-00-019, 54.3 acres, reduce from 21.3 acres at \$21.30 to 16.3 acres at \$16.30.

I recommend that the request be approved for hearing with the above mentioned changes in the drainage shed. A hearing should be set for June 6, 1983 at 1:30 P.M.
