Re: Little Eagle Creek Drain, Casey Road Extension

Attached is a drain map for the Little Eagle Creek Drain, Casey Road Extension. This proposed drain is located in Washington Township.

This extension was set out in my classification report to the Board dated February 15, 2011 and approved by the Board on February 28, 2011 at which time the Board referred the list to the Surveyor for maintenance and reconstruction of drains listed. (See Hamilton County Drainage Board Minutes Book 13, Pages 284-291). This extension is a reconstruction of the Little Eagle Creek Drain as per IC 36-9-27-34(b) (E). This report is being submitted per IC 36-9-27-49. This extension falls under subsection (b) (2) of Section 49. The drain is to be accepted in place without reconstruction costs or assessment.

I have made a personal inspection of the land described below. Upon doing so, I believe that the drain is practicable, will improve the public health, benefit a highway and be of public utility and that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed drain will probably be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of land likely to be benefited. The drain will consist of the following:

Open Ditch - 3,992 feet

The Little Eagle Creek Drain, Casey Road Extension shall begin at the west right of way line of Casey Road, and run downstream within the existing Little Eagle Creek 3,992 feet to the north right of way of 186th Street. The beginning point is the current terminus of the Little Eagle Creek Drain, Eagletown Extension, per my report dated May 3, 2007 and approved by the Board at hearing on June 25, 2007 (See Hamilton County Drainage Board Minutes Book 10, Pages 327-329). The ending point is the current beginning of the Little Eagle Creek Drain, 186th Street Extension, per my report dated February 22, 2010 and approved by the Board at hearing on May 24, 2010. (See Hamilton County Drainage Board Minutes Book 12, Pages 554-555).

The nature of future maintenance work required is as follows:

- 1. Bank erosion protection and/or seeding as might be required;
- 2. Removal of debris and/or blockages from existing open drain;
- 3. Removal of beaver dams;
- 4. Any other repairs necessary to restore proper flow to the open ditch.

The frequency with which future maintenance work should be performed is annually as required by the condition of the drain.

The easement for the drain on the affected parcels should be set at 75' from the top of bank as set out in IC 36-9-27-33. According to the FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Map, Map Number 18057C0110F and 18057C0120F, the area for the Little Eagle Creek Open Ditch is covered by the floodplain for Little Eagle Creek. Therefore, I believe that no damages will result to landowners by the regulating of this drain.

The matter of the proposed Reconstruction of the *Little Eagle Creek Drain, Casey Road Extension* came before the Hamilton County Drainage Board for hearing *on July 25, 2011*, on the Reconstruction Report consisting of the report and the Schedule of Damages and Assessments. The Board also received and considered the written objection of an owner of certain lands affected by the proposed Reconstruction, said owner being:

Evidence was heard on the Reconstruction Report and on the aforementioned objections.

The Board, having considered the evidence and objections, and, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did find and determine that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed Reconstruction will be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of all land benefited by the Reconstruction.

The Board having considered the evidence and objections, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did adopt the Schedule of Assessments as proposed, subject to amendment after inspection of the subject drain as it relates to the lands of any owners which may have been erroneously included or omitted from the Schedule of Assessments.

The Board further finds that it has jurisdiction of these proceedings and that all required notices have been duly given or published as required by law.

Wherefore, it is ORDERED, that the proposed Reconstruction of the Little Eagle Creek Drain, Casey Road Extension be and is hereby declared established.

Thereafter, the Board made inspection for the purpose of determining whether or not the lands of any owners had been erroneously included or excluded from the Schedule of Assessments. The Board finds on the basis of the reports and findings at this hearing as follows:

Notice of Hearing on Reconstruction & Schedule of Assessments and Damages on the Little Eagle Creek, Casey Road Extension.

Under the Indiana Drainage Code, all land which drains directly, or indirectly, is assessed for either maintenance cost or reconstruction cost within the drain. In making the calculation for each parcel, the Drainage Board must calculate the percentage of the cost attributable to each parcel of land benefitted. The Drainage Board has received a reconstruction report and schedule of assessments which affects your land. The purpose of the reconstruction project is to perform work which will substantially improve the drainage for the entire watershed served by the drain.

You are hereby notified that the reconstruction report of the County Surveyor and the schedule of assessments made by the Drainage Board have been filed and are available for public inspection in the office of the County Surveyor. The chart below contains your proposed assessment and your percentage of the total reconstruction assessment.

The reconstruction report of the Surveyor and schedule of damages and benefits as determined by the Drainage Board for the proposed improvement known as the Little Eagle Creek, Casey Road Extension have been filed and are available for inspection in the office of the County Surveyor. The schedule of assessments shows the following lands in your name are affected as follows. This assessment is not a charge for services associated with regulating the quality of storm water within your city or town.

The hearing on the Surveyor's reconstruction report and on the schedules of damages and assessments are set for hearing at 9:15 A.M. on July 25, 2011, in the Commissioner's Court. The law provides that objections must be written and filed not less than 5 days before the date of the hearing. Objections may be for causes as specified by law and which are available at the Surveyor's Office. Written evidence in support of objections may be filed. The failure to file objections constitutes a waiver of your right to thereafter object, either before the Board or in court on such causes, to any final action of the Board. On or before the day of the hearing before the Board, the Surveyor shall and any owner of affected lands may cause written evidence to be filed in support of or in rebuttal to any filed objections.
