Re: Little Eagle Creek Drain, George Coverdale Arm, Atwater Section 2

Attached is a request to vacate a portion of the Little Eagle Creek Drain, George Coverdale Arm filed by Olthof Homes Inc. The proposal is to vacate a portion of the existing drain on parcel 08-05-22-00-00-020.003 owned by Lake Acquisitions Inc.

The portion of the George Coverdale Arm of the Little Eagle Creek Drain to be vacated will begin at the northern limits of the parcel at Sta. 14+09 per the drains 1914 description. The drain then runs south for 567 feet before stopping at Sta. 19+76 per the drains 1914 description.

The request will remove 567 feet of 14-inch tile.

There are no upstream drains in this portion of the arm because the drain at Sta. 14+09 was capped and rerouted by the relocated bypass ditch that was approved with Atwater Section 1 (Drainage Board Minutes Book 20, page 167). The drainage that the existing tile serves will be accommodated by the proposed infrastructure for Atwater Section 2 which is not to be county regulated. The maintenance of this infrastructure will be the responsibility of the City of Westfield or the Atwater HOA.

Upon review of the request, I believe the above portion of the drain meets the requirements for vacation as set out in IC-36-9-27-34(d). In my opinion, the vacation will not adversely affect other property owners within the drainage shed.

I recommend the Board set a hearing date for October 24, 2022.
