RE: Little Eagle Creek Drain - Grand Park Arm

Attached is a petition filed by the City of Westfield along with plans and calculations for the Little Eagle Creek Drain, Grand Park Arm to be located in Washington Township. I have reviewed the submittals and petition and have found each to be in proper form.

I have made a personal inspection of the land described in the petition. Upon doing so, I believe that the drain is practicable, will improve the public health, benefit a public highway, and be of public utility and that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed drain will probably be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of land likely to be benefited. The drain will consist of the following:

115 feet of 24" SDR-35 Pipe from Str. 1 to Str. 2 166 feet of 24" SDR-35 Pipe from Str. 2 to Str. 3 282 feet of 24" SDR-35 Pipe from Str. 3 to Str. 4 281 feet of 24" SDR-35 Pipe from Str. 4 to Str. 5 279 feet of 24" SDR-35 Pipe from Str. 5 to Str. 6 400 feet of 30" HDPE Pipe from Str. 6 to Str. 7 400 feet of 30" HDPE Pipe from Str. 7 to Str. 8 400 feet of 30" HDPE Pipe from Str. 8 to Str. 9

The total length of the Little Eagle Creek Drain, Grand Park Arm will be 2323 feet.

The retention pond (lake) located upstream of Str. 1 is not to be considered part of the regulated drain. Only the outlet will be maintained as part of the regulated drain. The maintenance of the pond (lake) will be the responsibility of the City of Westfield. The Board will however retain jurisdiction for ensuring the storage volume for which the lake was designed will be retained. Thereby, allowing no fill or easement encroachments.

The cost of the proposed arm is to be paid by the City of Westfield.

Since this is a project by a municipal entity, City of Westfield, no bonds are required by the Drainage Board.

I believe this proposed drain meets the requirements for Urban Drain Classification as set out in IC 36-9-27-67 to 69. Therefore, this drain shall be designated as an Urban Drain.

The easement for the new drain will be 25 feet per half from the centerline of the new drain. The City of Westfield will provide recorded easement dedication and written descriptions in the near future.

I recommend the Board set a hearing for this proposed drain for August 22, 2011.

The Board also received and considered the written objection of an owner of certain lands affected by the proposed Reconstruction, said owner being:

Evidence was heard on the Reconstruction Report and on the aforementioned objections.

The Board, having considered the evidence and objections, and, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did find and determine that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed Reconstruction will be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of all land benefited by the Reconstruction.

The Board having considered the evidence and objections, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did adopt the Schedule of Assessments as proposed, subject to amendment after inspection of the subject drain as it relates to the lands of any owners which may have been erroneously included or omitted from the Schedule of Assessments.

The Board further finds that it has jurisdiction of these proceedings and that all required notices have been duly given or published as required by law.

Wherefore, it is ORDERED, that the proposed Reconstruction of the Little Eagle Creek Drain, Grand Park Arm be and is hereby declared established.

Attached are as-built, certificate of completion & compliance, and other information for Little Eagle Creek – Grand Park Arm. An inspection of the drainage facilities for this section has been made and the facilities were found to be complete and acceptable.

During construction, changes were made to the drain, which will alter the plans submitted with my report for this drain-dated July 6, 2011. The report was approved by the Board at the hearing held September 12, 2011. (See Drainage Board Minutes Book 13, Pages 566-568) The changes are as follows:

The 24" and 30" RCP was changed to 2391 feet of 36" RCP. The length of the drain due to the changes described above is now 2391feet.

The drainage easement was previously established at 25 feet per half in my above mentioned report to the Board. At this time the following easement documents have been recorded in the Recorder's Office under instrument #'s 2011044024 and 2013020592.

Sureties were not required as this project was paid for by the City of Westfield. I recommend the Board approve the drain's construction as complete and acceptable.






