Re: Mallery-Granger Drain, North Arm, 209<sup>th</sup> and Hague Road Roundabout Project Reconstruction

Attached are petition from the Hamilton County Commissioners and plans for the reconstruction of the Mallery-Granger Drain North Arm. The petition involves the reconstruction of a portion of the drain in the 209<sup>th</sup> street (a.k.a., Carrigan Road) and Hague Road right-of-way owned by Hamilton County and the City of Noblesville per the Road Plans for 'Roundabout Construction of Carrigan Road / Hague Road, by USI Consultants, Project No 1297562.

Per the above mentioned plans, the upstream end of this reconstruction begins at manhole Str. 20 near the new southwest side of the intersection, and includes 212' feet of pipe to where the pipe outlets into the open ditch on the east side of the roundabout.

This reconstruction consists of the following:

212' of 44" x 27" Elliptical RCP

The newly installed drain has a length of 212'.

This project replaces approximately 104'of open drain. As constructed per my report dated June 7, 1999 and approved by the Board on June 28, 1999 (see Hamilton County Drainage Board Minutes Book 5, pages 169-172). This project adds 108' to the footage of the drain's total length. Prior to this reconstruction, Station 0+00 was located near the previous east right-of-way line. This roundabout project has expanded the right-of-way at this location. The 1999 drain length reconstructed by this project is approximately 104', which is equivalent to stations 0+00 to 1+04 on the 1999 drain mapping.

In addition to the reconstruction of the regulated drain, other storm sewers and a detention area where installed as part of the roundabout project that are not part of this drain reconstruction.

The cost of this project has been paid by Hamilton County Highway Department. The petitioner did not submit surety for the proposed drain reconstruction, as this requirement has been waived for the Hamilton County Highway Department.

The new drain installation is within existing regulated drain easement within road rightof-way. Therefore, no additional easement is required.

A hearing for, this petition should be set for February 26, 2018.

# FINDINGS AND ORDER FOR RECONSTRUCTION

The matter of the proposed Reconstruction of the Mallery-Granger Drain, North Arm, 209th and Hague Road Roundabout Project Reconstruction came before the Hamilton County Drainage Board for hearing on February 26, 2018, on the Reconstruction Report consisting of the report and the Schedule of Damages and Assessments. The Board also received and considered the written objection of an owner of certain lands affected by the proposed Reconstruction, said owner being:

Evidence was heard on the Reconstruction Report and on the aforementioned objections.

The Board, having considered the evidence and objections, and, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did find and determine that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed Reconstruction will be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of all land benefited by the Reconstruction.

The Board having considered the evidence and objections, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did adopt the Schedule of Assessments as proposed, subject to amendment after inspection of the subject drain as it relates to the lands of any owners which may have been erroneously included or omitted from the Schedule of Assessments.

The Board further finds that it has jurisdiction of these proceedings and that all required notices have been duly given or published as required by law.

Wherefore, it is ORDERED, that the proposed Reconstruction of the Mallery-Granger Drain, North Arm, 209th and Hague Road Roundabout Project Reconstruction be and is hereby declared established.

Thereafter, the Board made inspection for the purpose of determining whether or not the lands of any owners had been erroneously included or excluded from the Schedule of Assessments. The Board finds on the basis of the reports and findings at this hearing as follows:
