Attached is an revised assessment roll, drain map, drainage shed map and reconstruction plans for the Mallot-Carson Drain.

Upon checking the outlet of the drain it was found that a clean out of the open ditch needs to be made. I have surveyed 1350' of the open ditch and found that at least 1000' should be reconstructed. I recommend that the first 1000' of the Jesse DeVaney Drain be included in the Mallot-Carson Drain: Maintenance program. This would bring the maintenance portion to the intersection of the Fred Seeright Drain. The cost estimate of the reconstruction is as follows.

The total number of acres assessed on the revised assessment roll is 485.82 acres. The reconstruction cost per acre will be \$8.42.

The maintenance assessment has been \$1.00 per acre since it was begun in 1971. The collection of the assessments for this drain was stopped during 1978-1981. The balance in the fund at present stands at \$577.66. I believe that the maintenance assessment should be increased to \$2.00 per acre.

On May 11th I made an inspection of the work done by Hendricks Excavating on the Mallot-Carson Drain. At this time I found that it has been reseeded as per letter of April 26th. Although the seed has not germinated as yet, I believe the work to be completed and acceptable. A work order will be sent sometime this summer to seed any remaining bare areas.

At this time Mr. Hendricks has submitted a release signed by Mr. Thomas releasing him from removal of the clearing debris. Also Mr. Hendricks has submitted a statement stating that all expense incurred for labor and materials have been paid in full.

The attached claim in the amount of \$540.00 representing 15% of the contract price shall be paid on July 5th. Upon this payment the contract will be paid in full. The contract price of \$3600.00 plus the extra work ordered on November 20, 1981 in the amount of \$400.00 comes to \$4000.00, which is below the estimate of \$4089.25 per my report of January 20, 1981 and the amount of \$4590.00 as per the encumberance on this reconstruction.
