REPORT OF THE DRAINAGE COMMISSIONERS

IN THE MATTER OF THE

STAHL ET AL DRAIN

The undersigned drainage commissioners and viewer, to whom was referred the above entittled petition for the drainage of certain lands in Addams Township, Hamilton County Indiana, would respectfully ##### show that as directed by the order of said court they hereby submit this their report. That as shown by the within report they have definitely determined the best and cheapest method of draining said lands. They have fixed the route, location and character of said work and fixed the same by meets and bounds, courses and distances, discriptions, grades and bench marks, including all provision for the complete drainage of the lands to be affected by the proposed work. That they have divided the drain into sections each not more than one hundred feet in length, that they have computed and set out the number of cubic yards of excavation in each station and they have assessed was benefits and damages as the case may be, to each separate tract of and and to the township where the highway is affected. That they have rum the line of said ditch so as to secure the best results and cause the least possible injury to the lands affected, and so as to benefit the public highway.

That in the course of said drain they have followed the old channel as near as forest and that the work should be done with a shovel.

That said drain when dens will be practical. That the same will improve I the public health. That the same will be of public utility and that the cost, damages and expenses of completing said work will be less than the benefits to the owners likely to be affected.

Said ditch has been divided into stations of one hundred feet each and numbered from station O at the beginning of the ditch testation 45

LOCATION

Commencing at the center of the south west quarter of the south east quarter of section I9 township 20 range 3 east and running thence north 30 degrees west 900 feet thence east forty*-five degrees north 800 feet thence north 500 feet thence west 45 degrees north 500 feet thence east 30 degrees north 500 feet thence north I200 feet to prairie creek in section I9 township 20 range 3 east.

SPECIFICATIONS

The ditch shall be tiled with 6" tile from station 0 to 9, 8" from station 9 to station 26, IO" from station 26 to station 32 and I2" tile from station 32 to station 45. There shall be five 3' joints of sewer tile where the ditch empties into Prairie Greek and a head wall not less tjan I2" thick 8' in length to begin I8" below the grade of prairie Greek and have sufficient height to retain the filling of said Stahl drain.

CONCRETE WORK

All concrete work shall be built in unyielding forms of dressed lumber. The concrete shall be mixed one part first quality of portland cement to five parts clean sharp sand and gravel, all exposed surfaces shall be finished with a mixture of one part of portland cement to two parts screened sand. The retaining wall shall be built so as to recieve all tile.

TILE

All tile and material used in this ditch must be first class and subject to the inspection of the superintendant in charge before being used in the ditch.
