RE: S. Moriarty Regulated Drain Reconstruction

Attached is a petition and plans, for the proposed reconstruction of the S. Moriarty Drain in Jackson Township. The plans were prepared by Byers Consulting. The reconstruction is being proposed by Beck's Superior Hybrids, Inc.

The original S. Moriarty Drain was ordered constructed in March 1910 by the Hamilton County Board of Commissioners. The original tile consists of 2,150 feet of 12" tile.

The new S. Moriarty Drain will consist of 2,135 feet of dual wall smooth bore HDPE pipe and 50 feet of 18" RCP for a total length of 2,185 feet.

The reconstructed drain shall begin at Station 0+00 of the original drain description and end at the outlet into the William P. Bennett Drain. From the outlet at Station 21+85 to Station 21+35 the drain will consist of 18" RCP. From Station 21+35 to Station 0+00 the drain will consist of 18" dual wall smooth bore HDPE pipe. There shall be a drop inlet installed at Station 0+00. From Station 0+00 to Station 6+00 the new tile will be run straight whereas the original tile had a curve in the line. The new alignment will be 23 feet from the old alignment at the greatest distance from the old alignment and will be within the existing easement. The new tile length will be 35 feet longer than the original tile.

The drop inlet at Station 0+00 shall consist of a 48" concrete manhole with a 24" behive casting. The manhole shall be located at the junction of the Moriarty Drain and the Butler Drain.

The matter of the proposed Reconstruction of the S. Moriarty Drain Reconstruction came before the Hamilton County Drainage Board for hearing on January 27, 2014, on the Reconstruction Report consisting of the report and the Schedule of Damages and Assessments. The Board also received and considered the written objection of an owner of certain lands affected by the proposed Reconstruction, said owner being:

Evidence was heard on the Reconstruction Report and on the aforementioned objections.

The Board, having considered the evidence and objections, and, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did find and determine that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed Reconstruction will be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of all land benefited by the Reconstruction.

The Board having considered the evidence and objections, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did adopt the Schedule of Assessments as proposed, subject to amendment after inspection of the subject drain as it relates to the lands of any owners which may have been erroneously included or omitted from the Schedule of Assessments.

The Board further finds that it has jurisdiction of these proceedings and that all required notices have been duly given or published as required by law.

Wherefore, it is ORDERED, that the proposed Reconstruction of the S. Moriarty Drain Reconstruction be and is hereby declared established.

Thereafter, the Board made inspection for the purpose of determining whether or not the lands of any owners had been erroneously included or excluded from the Schedule of Assessments. The Board finds on the basis of the reports and findings at this hearing as follows:


Reconstructing & realigning within existing easement. Easement will be slightly relocated with realignment. Original drain description describes 2150 feet.

Re: S. Moriarty Drain Reconstruction Final Inspection Report

Please regard this letter as the inspector's final report on the S. Moriarty Drain Reconstruction in Section 17, Township 20 North, Range 4 East, in Jackson Township, Hamilton County, Indiana.

The hearing for the S. Moriarty Drain Reconstruction was held on January 27, 2014 (see Hamilton County Drainage Board Minutes Book 15, pages 323-326). At this time the Board approved the project.

The Hamilton County Drainage Board approved the reconstruction of the Moriarty Drain to be done by Beck's Hybrids. Beck's Hybrids paid all costs associated with the reconstruction including the design for the project which was prepared by Byers Consulting.

The S. Moriarty Drain Reconstruction consists of 2,135 feet of dual wall smooth bore HDPE pipe and 50 feet of 18" RCP for a total of 2,185 feet of drain. The reconstruction replaced the existing 12" tile from Station 0+00 to Station 21+50 of the original 1910 description.

As of the date of this report, I hereby attest to and agree that the reconstruction has been installed according to the specified plans. All inspections have been completed. Mapping of the tile location was done by Beck's Hybrids.
