Re: Mud Creek / Sand Creek Drainage Area, Cyntheanne Road Extension

Attached is a drain map, drainage shed map and schedule of assessments for the extension of the Mud Creek Drain. This proposed drain is located in Fall Creek Township.

I have made a personal inspection of the land described below. Upon doing so, I believe that the drain is practicable, will improve the public health, benefit a public highway and be of public utility and that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed drain will probably be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of land likely to be benefited. The drain will consist of the following:

Open Ditch

1,838 ft.

The total length of the drain will be 1,838 feet.

The extension will begin at Sta. 138+30 of the Daniel Heiny Drain. This is the intersection of the Frank Keiser Drain with the Heiny Drain. The extension will follow the existing open ditch to the east line of Cyntheanne Road.

The rates for maintenance were established per my report dated March 21, 2005 which was approved by the Board at hearing on May 23, 2005. (See Hamilton County Drainage Board Minute Book 8, Pages 310-312)

I have reviewed the plans and drain map and believe, as set out in IC 36-9-27-69 (b) (1) that all tracts within the drainage shed of the Mud Creek Drain within this subdivision will benefit. I recommend the following maintenance assessment to be adopted by the Board:

- 1. Maintenance assessment for roads and streets be set at \$10.00 per acre.
- 2. Maintenance assessment for agricultural tracts be set at \$3.00 per acre with a \$15.00 minimum.
- 3. Maintenance assessment for non-platted residential tracts be set at \$3.00 per acre with a \$15.00 minimum.
- 4. Maintenance assessment for commercial institutional and multi-family residential tracts be set at \$10.00 per acre with a \$75.00 minimum.
- 5. Maintenance assessment for platted lots in subdivisions whose drainage systems will not be considered part of the regulated drain (those systems maintained by the Town of Fishers) shall be set at \$35.00 per lot \$35.00 minimum. Common areas within subdivisions whose drainage systems will not be part of the regulated drain (those systems maintained by the Town of Fishers) shall be set at \$5.00 per acre with a \$35.00 minimum.
- 6. Maintenance assessments for platted lots within a subdivision whose drainage system will be part of the regulated drain shall be set at \$65.00 per lot with a \$65.00 minimum. Common areas with regulated drain subdivisions shall be set at \$10.00 per acre with a \$65.00 minimum.

The annual maintenance collection for this extension will be \$128.96.

I believe this proposed drain meets the requirements for Urban Drain Classification as set out in IC 36-9-27-67 to 69. Therefore, this drain shall be designed as an Urban Drain.

The easements for the drain should be set at 75' from top of bank as set out in IC 36-9-27-33. Additional drainage easement will be added to the following tracts:

FINDINGS AND ORDER FOR RECONSTRUCTION

The Board further finds that it has jurisdiction of these proceedings and that all required notices have been duly given or published as required by law.

Wherefore, it is ORDERED, that the proposed Reconstruction of the Mud Creek/Sand Creek Drainage Area, Cyntheanne Road Extension be and is hereby declared established.
