RE: Mud Creek/Sand Creek Drain, Margaret Goodwin Arm Limestone Springs Relocation/Reconstruction

Attached is the petition, plans, non-enforcements, assessment roll and a map for the proposed relocation of the Margaret Goodwin Drain. The relocation was petitioned and completed by Centex Homes.

The drain was relocated and reconstructed through the Limestone Springs development per plans prepared by Stoeppelwerth and Associates for Limestone Springs Section 1A, plans dated October 28, 2004, Job No. 4412551 and Section 2C, plans dated March 28, 2005, Job No. 441252C.

Since the proposed relocation/reconstruction of the Margaret Goodwin Drain Section 2C has been replatted as the Condominiums Blocks (East of Marilyn Road), Sections 1A and 1B remain platted as proposed.

On February 20, 1979 the Board held a hearing to establish the drain maintenance assessment for the Margaret Goodwin Drain (Drainage Board Minutes Book 1, Page 294). The Margaret Goodwin Drain maintenance assessment affected 148.68 acres and 141 lots. On March 26, 2007 the Board held a hearing and approved the Surveyor's Report dated January 31, 2007 to consolidate the Margaret Goodwin Drain into the Mud Creek/Sand Creek Drainage Area (Drainage Minutes Book 10, Pages 173-174). The approval of this relocation/reconstruction will not affect current assessments in the area.

The new proposed relocated drain will consist of the following:

12" RCP – 42 LF 24" RCP – 295 LF 27" RCP – 374 LF 30" RCP – 1052 LF 36" RCP – 696 LF 42" RCP – 81 LF Open Drain – 1173 LF

The total length of new relocated drain shall be 3713 feet.

The 1662 feet of original Goodwin Drain between 13+08 and 29+70 in Limestone Springs 1B and the Condominium Blocks (formerly Sec. 2C) shall be vacated with this approval. This proposed relocation will add an additional 2051 feet to the drains total length.

Station 13+08 is the location of a manhole (Str.722C of Section 2C, now Condominium Blocks) which is located on the east property line of Limestone Springs. Station 29+70 is a precast 2 x 2 structure located in the south R/W for 136<sup>th</sup> Street east of the Travertine Way entrance into Sec. 1B off of 136<sup>th</sup> Street.

The remaining portion of the Margaret Goodwin Drain between Stations 29+70 and 38+40 across the Rollins tract (13-11-22-00-00-014.005) north of 136<sup>th</sup> Street will remain part of the regulated drain system and now is an arm of the Mud Creek/Sand Creek Drain.

The portion of new storm sewer regulated through Limestone Springs Sections 1A, 2A, 3A and Condominiums Blocks are the storm pipes located between the following structures through the following Limestone Springs sections:

#### Section 3A:

600-601, 601-602, 602-603, 614-615, 615-616, 616-617, 617-618, 618-619, 619-620

Sections 1A - 2A;

620-621, 621-628, 628-629, 629-630, 630-631, 631-632

Condominiums Blocks (East of Marilyn Road);

707-712, 712-713, 713-714, 712-713A, 713A-714A, 714A-715A, 715A-715, 715-716 and 722B-722C.

These lengths can be found on the above referenced development plans for the original Section 1A and 2C plans as follows:

#### Section 2C

The open drain length listed above in the totals is that portion through the lakes and across the Common Area (13-11-27-00-25-047.000) in Sections 1A, 2A, 3A and the Condominium Blocks:

Pond #3; 722B – 716, Pond #2; 712 -714, Pond #1; 614 -613 and Structure 600 to Sand Creek Drain. The relocated Goodwin Drain now enters into Sand Creek at a location approximately 192 feet south of the centerline of 136<sup>th</sup> Street in Limestone Springs Sec. 3A.

The retention ponds (Ponds #1, #2 and #3) located in Common Area 10, 20 and 30 are to be considered part of the regulated drain. Pond maintenance shall include inlet, outlet, sediment removal, and erosion control along the banks as part of the regulated drain. The maintenance of the ponds such as mowing and aquatic vegetation control will be the responsibility of the Homeowners Association. The Board will also retain

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jurisdiction for ensuring the storage volume for which the pond was designed will be retained, thereby, allowing no fill or easement encroachments.

The new regulated drain easement affects the following parcels in Limestone Springs. The regulated drain easements are those widths as shown on the Secondary Plats for Sections 1A, 2A, 3A and the Condominium plats. Those easement widths are as follows for: Sec. 1A - 15' per half, Sec. 2A - 15' per half, Sec. 3A - 15' per half or 30' total and the Condominium plats - 30' R.D.E.

Attached are the Secondary Plats for Limestone Springs, Sections 1A, 2A, 3A and the Condominium's Grantor Dedication Exhibit. The regulated drain easements shall be those easements as shown on the Secondary Plats for Limestone Springs, Sections 1A, 2A, 3A, and the Condominiums Grantor Dedication Exhibit as recorded in the Office of the Hamilton County Recorder in Plat Cabinet 3, Slide 552, Plat Cabinet 3, Slide 682, Plat Cabinet 4, Slide 74 and Plat Cabinet 3, Slide 684, respectively.

The cost of the relocation was paid by Centex Homes. The project falls under the requirements as set out in IC 36-9-27-52.0. Therefore, a public hearing is required for the petition.

The above Sureties were released by the Board on March 26, 2006 for Sec. 1B and for Sec. 2C on the September 8, 2008 Drainage Board meetings, (See Hamilton County Drainage Board minutes Book 9, Page 158 and Book 11, Page 314, respectively).

The non-enforcement request for Limestone Springs Section 2A was approved at the June 12, 2006 Drainage Board meeting. I recommend to Board approve the attached non-enforcement request. The requests is for the reduction of the regulated drain easement to those widths as shown on the secondary plat for Limestone Springs Section 1A, Limestone Springs Section 2A and Limestone Springs Condominiums, Grantor Dedication Exhibit.

I request the Board set this relocation for hearing on July 26, 2010.



## FINDINGS AND ORDER FOR RECONSTRUCTION

The matter of the proposed Reconstruction of the Mud Creek/Sand Creek Drainage Area, Margaret Goodwin Arm, Limestone Springs Relocation/Reconstruction came before the Hamilton County Drainage Board for hearing on July 26, 2010, on the Reconstruction Report consisting of the report and the Schedule of Damages and Assessments. The Board also received and considered the written objection of an owner of certain lands affected by the proposed Reconstruction, said owner being:

Evidence was heard on the Reconstruction Report and on the aforementioned objections.

The Board, having considered the evidence and objections, and, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did find and determine that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed Reconstruction will be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of all land benefited by the Reconstruction.

The Board having considered the evidence and objections, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did adopt the Schedule of Assessments as proposed, subject to amendment after inspection of the subject drain as it relates to the lands of any owners which may have been erroneously included or omitted from the Schedule of Assessments.

The Board further finds that it has jurisdiction of these proceedings and that all required notices have been duly given or published as required by law.

Wherefore, it is ORDERED, that the proposed Reconstruction of the Mud Creek/Sand Creek Drainage Area, Margaret Goodwin Arm, Limestone Springs Relocation/Reconstruction be and is hereby declared established.

Thereafter, the Board made inspection for the purpose of determining whether or not the lands of any owners had been erroneously included or excluded from the Schedule of Assessments. The Board finds on the basis of the reports and findings at this hearing as follows:

The length of the drain due to the changes described above is now 3611 feet. The original Margaret Goodwin Drain was vacated from Station 13+08 to Station 29+70 and thus removing 1,662 feet of tile. Therefore, the project added 1,949 feet of drain to the overall watershed.

The easements for this project will be those set out in the various secondary plats for the Limestone Springs development. These were outlined in my report to the board dated May 18, 2010.

The sureties were also outlined in the above mentioned report. The sureties were released on March 26, 2006 and on September 8, 2008. (See DRB Book 9, page 158 and Book 11 page 314)


I recommend the Board approve the drain's construction as complete and acceptable.




