Re: Mud Creek – Sand Creek Drainage Area: TJ Patterson Arm, 136th Street Reconstruction

Attached is a petition and plans for the proposed reconstruction of the TJ Patterson Arm, 136th Street Reconstruction. The reconstruction is being proposed by the City of Noblesville. The proposal is to reconstruct a portion of the drain within the right-of-way of 136th Street as part of the Corporate Parkway Pond project per plans by American Consulting, Inc., project 2013.00414 and dated 1/6/2014. This portion of new drain will be installed from existing Str. #127 to the open ditch. This reconstruction will replace existing 24" RCP with 36" RCP. Str. #127 manhole will also be replaced to accommodate the new pipe. A private pipe serving as the pond outfall will tie into Str. #127 and has been approved per Outlet Permit O-2014-00017. The existing drain, referred to as the 136th Street Reconstruction, was referenced in my report dated June 9, 2006 and approved by the Drainage Board on July 24, 2006 as recorded in Drainage Board Minutes Book 9, Pages 350-352.

This line will consist of the following:

20' of 36" RCP

The total length of the new reconstructed drain pipe shall be 20 feet. This proposal will add no additional footage to the drain's total length.

Because the petitioner is the City of Noblesville, the requirement for posting surety, in the form of a performance bond or letter of credit, has been waived.

The reconstruction will occur in place within the existing easement. Therefore, no changes to the easement are required.

The project falls under the requirements as set out in IC 36-9-27-52.5. Therefore, a hearing is not required for the petition. I recommend approval of this project.



TJ Patterson - 136th Street Reconstruction Corporate Parkway Pond (pipe in yellow)







Re: TJ Patterson Drain – 136th Street Reconstruction (Corporate Parkway Pond)

Attached are as-builts, certificate of completion & compliance, and other information for 136th Street Reconstruction. An inspection of the drainage facilities for this section has been made and the facilities were found to be complete and acceptable.

During construction, changes were made to the drain, which will alter the plans submitted with my report for this drain-dated February 24, 2014. The report was approved by the Board at the hearing held February 24, 2014. (See Drainage Board Minutes Book 15, Pages 349-350) The changes are as follows:

The 36" RCP was lengthened from 20 feet to 24 feet.

The length of the drain due to the changes described above is now 24 feet.

* It should be noted that this replace 20 feet of existing 24" RCP.

The work was paid for by the City of Noblesville and all work was completed within existing easement. Therefore, no changes to the easement were required.

I recommend the Board approve the drain's construction as complete and acceptable.
