Re: Overman Harvey Drain, Village of Mount Carmel Section 10 Reconstruction

Attached is a petition and plans for the proposed reconstruction of the Overman Harvey Drain, Village of Mount Carmel Section 10 Arm. The reconstruction is being proposed by the City of Carmel. The proposal is to reconstruct the drain to provide drainage for part Village of Mount Carmel Section 1 and Section 2. The reconstruction is as shown per plans by Cripe Architects + Engineers, having Job No. 0090388-20100, and dated August 16, 2010, sheets C202, C203, and C204, and as shown on Exhibit 1 dated October 26, 2010.

The reconstruction will remove 40 feet of 18" RCP from the Village of Mount Carmel Section 10 Arm, starting at Structure 32 and running east. New Structure 714 will be set at this location and 40 feet of 24" RCP will replace the pipe that was removed. Then to improve drainage in Village of Mount Carmel Section 1 and 2, the storm sewers as shown of C202, C203, and C204 of the plans were installed.

The new drain installed for Village of Mount Carmel drainage will consist of the following:

12" RCP	975 ft.	24" RCP	1013 ft.
15" RCP	150 ft.	6" SSD	532 ft.
18" RCP	25 ft.	8" SSD	294 ft.

The total length of new drain shall be 2,989 feet. The 40 feet of the Overman Harvey Drain, Village of Mount Carmel Section 10 Arm, from Str. 32 to new Str. 714 shall be vacated. This proposal will add 2,949 feet to the drain's total length. The new storm sewer shall be approved as installed.

The cost of the reconstruction was paid by the City of Carmel.

Since the parcels listed below now benefit from the Overman Harvey Drain, I recommend each lot be assessed equally to the Overman Harvey maintenance assessment. The maintenance assessment rates are \$3.00 per acres, with a \$30.00 minimum, \$3.00 per acre for roadways. With this assessment the total annual assessment for this section of the drain will be \$906.80.

The easement for this drain will be the existing right of way of Village Park North Drive, Village Park East Drive, Bennett Road, and Amalfi Drive, all owned by the City of Carmel.

I recommend the Board set a hearing for this proposed drain for November 28,

2011.

The Board also received and considered the written objection of an owner of certain lands affected by the proposed Reconstruction, said owner being:

Evidence was heard on the Reconstruction Report and on the aforementioned objections.

The Board, having considered the evidence and objections, and, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did find and determine that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed Reconstruction will be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of all land benefited by the Reconstruction.

The Board having considered the evidence and objections, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did adopt the Schedule of Assessments as proposed, subject to amendment after inspection of the subject drain as it relates to the lands of any owners which may have been erroneously included or omitted from the Schedule of Assessments.

The Board further finds that it has jurisdiction of these proceedings and that all required notices have been duly given or published as required by law.

Wherefore, it is ORDERED, that the proposed Reconstruction of the Overman-Harvey Drain, Village of Mount Carmel Section 10 Reconstruction be and is hereby declared established.

Thereafter, the Board made inspection for the purpose of determining whether or not the lands of any owners had been erroneously included or excluded from the Schedule of Assessments. The Board finds on the basis of the reports and findings at this hearing as follows:
