

Re: Paulsel & Vance & Peter Paulsel Drain

Attached is a petition and plans for the proposed relocation of the Peter Paulsel Drain. The relocation is being proposed by The Precedent, LLC. The proposal is to remove the tile portion of the drain between STA 28+00 and STA 42+00 of the original description. This shall be replaced by the proposed gravel pit/pond on the Precedent, LLC property. The portion of the drain between STA 57+70 and STA 59+80 shall be replaced by new storm sewer. The portion of the drain between STA 59+80 and STA 65+00 is now located within the pit area on the Featherston Property.

This new line will consist of the following:

12" RCP – 120 Feet 15" RCP – 1,278 Feet 18" RCP – 241 Feet

The existing tile between STA 42+00 and STA 57+70 shall remain in place at this time. The portion which is described above as being within the proposed gravel pit/pond on the Precedent property, between STA 28+00 and 42+00, shall be considered as open ditch so as to maintain continuity in the system. This length shall not be removed from the overall length of the drain.

The total length of new tile shall be 1,639 feet. The 3,180 feet of original drain between STA 28+00 and STA 59+80 shall not be vacated. This proposal will add an additional 1, 639 feet to the drains total length.

The petitioner has provided the Performance Bond as follows:

Bond Term (1 year max): January 10, 2001

Attached is a non-enforcement of easement for the regulated drain easement for the new section of storm sewer across the Precedent, LLC Property. This is for tract 10-10-14-00-007.000 as described in instrument number 8803554. This covers the new section of pipe which is shown on the plans from STA 0, STR 1 to STA 9, STR 5. I recommend the Board approve the non-enforcement at this time.

Also attached is a drainage easement for the portion of new storm sewer, which is crossing tract 10-10-14-00-00-006.000, which is owned by Wilfong Development Company. This is for the section of storm sewer as shown on the plans from STA 9, STR 5 to STA 14, STR 7. I recommend the Board accept this easement at this time.

The cost of the relocation is to be paid by The Precedent, LLC. Because the project is outside of the boundaries of the petitioners property, the project falls under the requirements as set out in IC 36-9-27-52. Therefore, a hearing is required for the petition.

I also recommend the Board increase the current \$3.00 minimum to a \$10.00 minimum assessment.

I recommend the Board set a hearing for March 27, 2000 at this time.

The original plan for the Reconstruction/Relocation of the Peter Paulsel Drain was approved at March 27, 2000 Drainage Board Meeting. Due to the current gravel and sand mining occurring at this time the property owner, The Precedent, LLC has requested that a temporary outlet be constructed.

This temporary outlet will consist of the following:

283-feet of 12-inch HDPE pipe.

The pipe will extend from the regional detention pond to the Str. #3. This pipe will be installed under the current bond for reconstruction; HCDB - BOO - 001.

This Performance Bond, HCDB - BOO - 001 is as follows:

Bond Date: January 10, 2000 Bond Amount: \$54,142.00

Bond Term (1yr. max): January 10, 2001

The maintenance of 283-feet of 12-inch HDPE will be maintained by the property owner until completion of the mining operation, when development occurs at this location or at the request of the Hamilton County Surveyor's Office.

The original design for the reconstruction consisted of the following:

120-feet of 12-inch RCP from the retention pond to Str. # 2 and 159-feet of 15-inch RCP from Str. #2 to Str. # 3.

This permanent line will be constructed at a future time when development occurs in this area. The property owner will submit a performance bond for later installation of the line. This bond will run concurrent until the completion of the mining operation, when development occurs at this location or at the request of the Hamilton County Surveyor's Office. The bond will be submitted prior to the installation of the temporary line.

The construction of the temporary line and the completion of the permanent line in the future will be paid by The Precedent, LLC. This project is located within the boundaries of the petitioners' property. Therefore, a hearing is not required.

## Re: Paulsel, Vance & Peter Paulsel Drain: Precedent Relocation

Attached are as-builts, certificate of completion & compliance, and other information for Precedent Relocation. An inspection of the drainage facilities for this section has been made and the facilities were found to be complete and acceptable.

During construction, changes were made to the drain, which will alter the plans submitted with my report for this drain-dated January 24, 2000. The report was approved by the Board at the hearing held March 27, 2000. (See Drainage Board Minutes Book 5, Pages 331-333) The changes are as follows:

The length of the drain due to the changes described above is now **1692 feet**. It should be noted that the original tile from Sta. 61+10 to Sta. 63+85 was removed. Therefore, this project added 1417 feet to the drain's overall length.

The non-enforcement was approved by the Board at its meeting on April 10, 2000 and recorded under instrument #200000030454 and the drainage easement under instrument #2009040614.

The following sureties were guaranteed by Washington International Ins. Co. and expired on January 10, 2001.
