RE: Paulsel, Vance, Paulsel Drain; The Legacy Partial Relocation, Vacation and Shed Change

Attached is a petition and plans for the proposed relocation of the Paulsel, Vance, and Paulsel Drain. The relocation is being proposed by East Carmel, LLC. The proposal is to reconfigure the drain for the new entrance of the Legacy onto 146^{th} Street, which will change storm structure castings on the Paulsel, Vance, and Paulsel Drain and add new footage to the drain. Part of the drain will also be vacated on the Legacy Development from Sta. 0+00 to Sta. 9+17 of the original 1891 legal description and 26 feet of 8" plastic pipe that is part of the 146^{th} Street Reconstruction.

The changes to the drain shall consist of changing the castings on existing Structures 134 and 137 from solid manhole castings to new curb inlet castings. Also, the castings on existing Structure 133 and 136 are being changed from curb inlet castings to flat inlet castings, so that the drainage on 146th Street is maintained. The end section at existing Structure 129C is being removed and replaced with a manhole structure, which is shown in the current plans as Structure 126. This is all shown on sheet C402 of The Legacy Master Infrastructure Phase One plans by Stoeppelwerth and Associates, dated 3/3/07 and having job number 55115S1.

The additional new drain shall be the length of pipe between the following structures: existing Str. 137 to new Structure 129, Structure 128, then 124, and ending at Structure 123 on the current plans.

The drain in total will consist of the following lengths:

12" RCP – 152 ft

The total length of new tile shall be 152 feet. The 943 feet of original drain between Sta. 0+00 and approximately Sta. 9+17 and 8" plastic pipe shall be vacated. This proposal will remove 791 feet from the drains total length.

The following tracts should be removed from the Paulsel, Vance, and Paulsel Drain maintenance assessments and added to the Tunis Gerard Drain maintenance assessment.

This change will result in a decrease of \$56.00 to the Paulsel, Vance, and Paulsel Drain maintenance assessment and a net increase of \$56.00 to the Tunis Gerard Drain maintenance assessment.

The cost of the relocation is to be paid by the East Carmel, LLC.

Comes now the undersigned individuals, who petition the Hamilton County Drainage Board, per IC 36-9-27, for the reconstruction of the above referenced regulated drain. The undersigned believe the following:

- 1. They are owners of ten percent (10%) in acreage or more of land area alleged by the petition to be affected by the drain.
- 2. That as property owners within the drainage shed, they are qualified petitioners.
- 3. That they now desire that a regulated drain be reconstructed in _____ Clay Township.
- 4. The names ad address of each owner affected by the proposed public drainage are attached hereto, made a part hereof, and marked Exhibit "A", which area of land involved in the proposed drainage area is located in section 23, township 18 north, range 4 east, Hamilton County, Indiana.
- 5. That the proposed reconstruction consists of removal of 943' of existing tile, changing existing end

sections with new beehive inlets, and construction of new 12" RCP and curb inlets for Community Drive

all as shown on plans by Stoeppelwerth and Assoc entitled The Legacy Master Infrastructure Phase 1.

FINDINGS AND ORDER FOR RECONSTRUCTION

The matter of the proposed Reconstruction of the Paulsel, Vance, Paulsel Drain, The Legacy Partial Relocation, Vacation and Shed Change came before the Hamilton County Drainage Board for hearing on February 25, 2008, on the Reconstruction Report consisting of the report and the Schedule of Damages and Assessments. The Board also received and considered the written objection of an owner of certain lands affected by the proposed Reconstruction, said owner being:

Evidence was heard on the Reconstruction Report and on the aforementioned objections.

The Board, having considered the evidence and objections, and, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did find and determine that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed Reconstruction will be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of all land benefited by the Reconstruction.

The Board having considered the evidence and objections, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did adopt the Schedule of Assessments as proposed, subject to amendment after inspection of the subject drain as it relates to the lands of any owners which may have been erroneously included or omitted from the Schedule of Assessments.

The Board further finds that it has jurisdiction of these proceedings and that all required notices have been duly given or published as required by law.

Wherefore, it is ORDERED, that the proposed Reconstruction of the Paulsel, Vance, Paulsel Drain, The Legacy Partial Relocation, Vacation and Shed Change be and is hereby declared established.

Thereafter, the Board made inspection for the purpose of determining whether or not the lands of any owners had been erroneously included or excluded from the Schedule of Assessments. The Board finds on the basis of the reports and findings at this hearing as follows:

Attached are as-builts, certificate of completion & compliance, and other information for The Legacy Partial Relocation. An inspection of the drainage facilities for this section has been made and the facilities were found to be complete and acceptable.

During construction, changes were made to the drain, which will alter the plans submitted with my report for this drain-dated December 4, 2007. The report was approved by the Board at the hearing held February 25, 2008. (See Drainage Board Minutes Book 11, Pages 52-55) The changes are as follows:

The length of 12" RCP was lengthened from 152 feet to 218 feet.

The length of the drain due to the changes described above is now 218 feet.

A non-enforcement was not requested for this project. The surety for this project was guaranteed by Bond Safeguard and released by the Board on its September 8, 2008 meeting.


