Re: Pebble Brook Drain, Promenade Extension

Attached is a drain map, drainage shed map and schedule of assessments for the extension of the Pebble Brook Drain from the north property line of tract 10-06-34-00-00-025.001 to the east right of way line of Mill Creek Road. This proposed drain is located in Noblesville Township.

I have made a personal inspection of the land described below. Upon doing so, I believe that the drain is practicable, will improve the public health, benefit a public highway and be of public utility and that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed drain will probably be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of land likely to be benefited. The drain will consist of the following:

Open Ditch

3,300 ft.

The total length of the drain will be 3,300 feet.

The extension will begin at the east right of way line of Mill Creek Road. The extension will follow the existing open ditch upstream to the north line of tract 10-06-34-00-00-025.001 which is owned by Promenade Creek, LLC.

I have reviewed the plans and drain map and believe, as set out in IC 36-9-27-69 (b) (1) that the parcels described on the attached assessment schedule are within the drainage shed of the Pebble Brook Drain and therefore benefit from the drain. I recommend the following maintenance assessments be established for this portion of the drainage shed:

- 1. Maintenance assessment for roads and streets be set at \$10.00 per acre.
- 2. Maintenance assessment for agricultural tracts be set at \$2.00 per acre with a \$15.00 minimum.
- 3. Maintenance assessment for non-platted residential tracts be set at \$2.00 per acre with a \$15.00 minimum.
- 4. Maintenance assessment for commercial, institutional and multi-family residential tracts be set at \$10.00 per acre with a \$75.00 minimum.

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- 5. Maintenance assessment for platted lots in subdivisions whose drainage system will not be part of the regulated drain (those systems maintained by the City of Noblesville) shall be set at \$35.00 per lot/minimum. Common areas within non-regulated drain subdivisions shall be assessed at \$5.00 per acre with a \$35.00 minimum.
- 6. Maintenance assessment for platted lots within subdivisions whose drainage system will be part of the regulated drain shall be set at \$65.00 per lot/minimum. Common areas within the regulated drain subdivision shall be set at \$10.00 per acre with a \$65.00 minimum.

The annual maintenance collection for this extension will be \$223.66. Collections for this extension will begin in 2008.

The nature of maintenance work for this area will consist of the following:

- 1. Bank erosion repair and protection as might be required;
- 2. Removal of beaver dams:
- 3. Removal of any obstructions within the flowline as might be required;
- 4. Any other repairs necessary to restore the drain to a serviceable condition.

The frequency with which maintenance work should be performed is annually as required by the condition of the drain.

I believe this proposed drain meets the requirements for Urban Drain Classification as set out in IC 36-9-27-67 to 69. Therefore, this drain shall be designed as an Urban Drain.

The easements for the drain should be set at 75' from top of bank as set out in IC 36-9-27-33 on the following tracts:

Promenade Creek, LLC Promenade Woods, LLC Promenade Villas, LLC

Hamilton County Highway

10-06-34-00-00-025.001

10-06-34-00-00-022.001

10-06-34-00-00-022.002

Mill Creek Road Right of Way

I recommend that the Board set a hearing for this extension for March 26, 2007.

FINDINGS AND ORDER FOR RECONSTRUCTION

The matter of the proposed Reconstruction of the **Pebblebrook Drain, Promenade Extension** came before the Hamilton County Drainage Board for hearing **on March 26, 2007**, on the Reconstruction Report consisting of the report and the Schedule of Damages and Assessments. The Board also received and considered the written objection of an owner of certain lands affected by the proposed Reconstruction, said owner being:

Evidence was heard on the Reconstruction Report and on the aforementioned objections.

The Board, having considered the evidence and objections, and, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did find and determine that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed Reconstruction will be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of all land benefited by the Reconstruction.

The Board having considered the evidence and objections, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did adopt the Schedule of Assessments as proposed, subject to amendment after inspection of the subject drain as it relates to the lands of any owners which may have been erroneously included or omitted from the Schedule of Assessments.

The Board further finds that it has jurisdiction of these proceedings and that all required notices have been duly given or published as required by law.

Wherefore, it is ORDERED, that the proposed Reconstruction of the **Pebblebrook Drain**, **Promenade Extension** be and is hereby declared established.

Thereafter, the Board made inspection for the purpose of determining whether or not the lands of any owners had been erroneously included or excluded from the Schedule of Assessments. The Board finds on the basis of the reports and findings at this hearing as follows:
