TO: Hamilton County Drainage Board

RE: Revis-Carson Drain Extension

Attached is a drain map for the extension of the Revis-Carson Drain. This proposed drain is located in Jackson Township.

I have made a personal inspection of the land described below. Upon doing so, I believe that the drain is practicable, will improve the public health, benefit a highway and be of public utility and that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed drain will probably be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of land likely to be benefited. The drain will consist of the following:

Open Ditch - 275 feet

The extension shall begin at Sta. 74+97 of the Revis Carson Drain, per the Viewers Report to the Hamilton County Commissioners dated November 2, 1889. Thence run downstream within the existing Hinkle Creek 275 feet to its intersection with the Isaac Jones Drain.

The easement for the drain should be set at 75' from the top of bank as set out in IC36-9-27-33. According to the FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Map, Map Number 18057C0130F, this area is covered by the flood plain for Hinkle Creek.

Additional easement will be added to the following tract:

FINDINGS AND ORDER FOR RECONSTRUCTION

The matter of the proposed Reconstruction of the **Revis-Carson**Drain Extension came before the Hamilton County Drainage Board for hearing on August 24, 2009, on the Reconstruction Report consisting of the report and the Schedule of Damages and Assessments. The Board also received and considered the written objection of an owner of certain lands affected by the proposed Reconstruction, said owner being:

Evidence was heard on the Reconstruction Report and on the aforementioned objections.

The Board, having considered the evidence and objections, and, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did find and determine that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed Reconstruction will be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of all land benefited by the Reconstruction.

The Board having considered the evidence and objections, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did adopt the Schedule of Assessments as proposed, subject to amendment after inspection of the subject drain as it relates to the lands of any owners which may have been erroneously included or omitted from the Schedule of Assessments.

The Board further finds that it has jurisdiction of these proceedings and that all required notices have been duly given or published as required by law.

Wherefore, it is ORDERED, that the proposed Reconstruction of the ${\bf Revis-Carson\ Drain\ Extension}$ be and is hereby declared established.

Thereafter, the Board made inspection for the purpose of determining whether or not the lands of any owners had been erroneously included or excluded from the Schedule of Assessments. The Board finds on the basis of the reports and findings at this hearing as follows:
