Re: Revis Carson Drain

It has recently come to the attention of this office that several property owners within the drainage shed of the Revis Carson Drain wish to subdivide their parcels. This was reported to the Board at its meeting on April 9, 2007 (Drainage Board Minutes Book 10, Pages 202-203).

Upon review and inspection of this drain it has been found and determined that the drain is inadequate to handle any additional drainage other than one single family residence with an out building on each of the following tracts:

This shall limit each tract to one connection of no larger than 6" diameter. This connection shall be for the purpose of septic perimeter drain, sump pump drain for residence basement or crawl space and foundation perimeter drain.

Any further construction of impervious surface shall overload the existing tile and shall require reconstruction of the Revis Carson Drain as per IC 36-9-27-17.

RESOLUTION NO. DB-05-29-07-B

A RESOLUTION OF THE HAMILTON COUNTY DRAINAGE BOARD CONCERNING THE REVIS CARSON DRAIN

WITNESS THAT:

WHEREAS, the Hamilton County Drainage Board has jurisdiction to regulate the discharge of storm water from certain parcels of real estate which directly or indirectly discharge into the Revis Carson Drain ("the Drain"); and,

WHEREAS, the Hamilton County Surveyor has been advised that owners of certain parcels within the drainage shed served by the Drain, ("the Watershed") are interested in developing said parcels; and,

WHEREAS, the development of the parcels within the Watershed served by the Drain will create additional impervious surface which will result in additional storm water being discharged into the Drain; and,

WHEREAS, the Hamilton County Surveyor, pursuant to the authority granted by Indiana Code 36-9-27-17(d) has investigated the condition of the Drain which serves the Watershed; and, WHEREAS, the Report further includes a finding that the Drain is inadequate to handle additional flow of water resulting from more than a few additional connections without being reconstructed, and recommends that further connections to the Drain be substantially limited until the Drain is reconstructed under Indiana Code 36-9-27-49 through Indiana Code 36-9-27-17; and,

WHEREAS, a Notice of a Public Hearing to consider the Report was duly published at least ten (10) days in advance of the public hearing held on May 29, 2007, and the property owners within the Watershed have been mailed the Notice of the Public Hearing; and,

WHEREAS, the Drainage Board has held a public hearing on May 29, 2007, and considered all of the evidence presented at the public hearing, including the Report.

IT IS THEREBY RESOLVED by the Hamilton County Drainage Board as follows:

- The Hamilton County Drainage Board hereby ratifies and approves the Report of the Hamilton County Surveyor of May 3, 2007.
- 2. Because of the limited capacity of the Drain, the only way to equitably allocate access to the Drain is to permit one residential connection for each parcel in the Watershed. The connection shall be for the purpose of a septic perimeter drain, a sump pump drain for residence basement or crawl space and foundation perimeter drain.
- The Hamilton County Drainage Board will not permit more than one residential connection, to discharge directly or indirectly into the Revis Carson Drain, from the above parcels of real estate. Should any parcel be split or subdivided from the above parcels, those resulting parcels will not be
