VACATION HEARING

Mr. Jack Hittle spoke to the Board about relocating the tile drain across Noble Manor Apartments to State Road #32 and install a larger culvert. The school had allocated \$400,000.00 toward the cost of off-site drainage for the reconstruction of Elwood Wilson Drainage Area. The school wanted the Board's input as to whether the County, City and State would be willing to pay the balance of the reconstruction project.
