**Johnathan Stansbury Ditch
Hancock County 1882 Legal Description**

By a ditch commencing, 35 Rods (577.5 feet) South of the Northeast Corner of the Southwest Quarter of Section 17, T17, R6, Running thence Northwest 40 Rods (660 feet), thence North 40 Rods (660 feet), thence West 30 Rods (495 feet), thence Northwest 116 Rods (1914 feet), thence North 40 Rods (660 feet), thence West 89 Rods (1468.5 feet), thence Southwest 72 Rods (1188 feet), thence South 70 Rods (1155 feet), thence West 120 Rods (1980 feet), thence North 48 Rods (792 feet), thence Northwest 40 Rods (660 feet), thence North 24 Rods (396 feet), thence Northwest 40 Rods (660 feet), to and ending at a point 20 Rods (330 feet) and 27 Rods (445.5 feet) North of the Southwest Corner, Section 7, T17, R7 East

Said ditch at the head of the commencement shall be four feet deep, one foot wide at the bottom and nine feet wide at the top, that it shall continue to deepen and widen gradually to the lower end so as to give a uniform face throughout upon the bottom thereof of six feet per mile, at the lower end a width at the bottom of two feet, the bank to be cut smooth and with a uniform slope, and the earth to be excavated to be deposited not nearer than two feet from the top of the bank.

The undersigned
Commissioners of Drainage, to whom was
refused the petition of Jonathan Stanley
for the drainage of the following described
real estate in Hancock County State of
Indiana to wit: The South East pr. of the North East
quarter S. 18 T. 17 N. C. and the South West pr. of the
North East - d 17 T. 17 N. C. E. east.

Respectfully report that they have in-
spected, personally all the lands described
in said petition and all other lands liable
to be affected by the construction of
the proposed work, and are of the opinion
that the proposed drainage, will improve
the public's health, of the neighborhood where
said work is located, and that the same
will be of public's utility in the County
of Hancock, and that the same can be
accomplished, at an expense, less than the
aggregate benefits, to the lands to be affec-
ted thereby, and after causing the necessary
survey, and examinations to be made, they
determined that the method of Draining
should be as follows to wit:

by a ditch commencing 35 rods south of
the north east corner of the South West quarter
of section 17. T. 17. R. 6. running thence with
West 40 rods, thence North 40 rods, thence
West 30 rods, thence North West 116 rods, thence
North 40 rods, thence West 87 rods, thence South
West 72 rods, thence South 70 rods, thence West
130 rods, thence North 48 rods, thence North
West 40 rods, thence North 24 rods, thence
North West 40 rods to and ending at
a point 30 rods East and 28 rods
North of the South West corner, section
7. T. 17. R. 6 East.

Not exceeding ditch at the head of
commissary road - shall be four
feet-deep, one foot wide at the bottom
and nine feet wide at the top. That it
shall continue to appear, and
widens gradually to the lower end
so as to give a uniform face through
out, upon the bottom thereof, of
six feet per mile, at the lower end
width at the bottom of two feet
the banks to be cut smooth and
with a uniform slope, and the
earth to be excepted to be deposited
not nearer than two feet from
the top of the banks
