Re: Stony Creek / Locke Arm, 191st Street to 196th Street Reconstruction

The Hamilton County Drainage Board held a public hearing on May 24th, 2010 regarding a proposed reconstruction project known as the Stony Creek Drain / Locke Arm. (See Drainage Board Meeting Minutes, Book 12, pages 568 – 586) The original hearing on May 24th, 2010, indicated an estimated cost of \$1,372,295.00. The Hamilton County Drainage Board continued the hearing until July 26th, 2010.

At the July 26th 2010 Drainage Board meeting six (6) options were presented. Option #6 was approved with an estimated cost of \$556,151.50. (See Drainage Board Meeting Minutes, Book 13, pages 76-81) The reconstruction assessments were reduced to the revised cost estimate. Assessments under \$100 have been certified to start collections in 2011. Assessments over \$100 have been split and the first half will start collections in 2011 and the second half will start collections in 2012.

Option #6 reconstructed the Stony Creek / Locke Arm from 196th Street to 211th Street. The project included dredging, tree removal on the operational side, sediment basins, pipe outlets, rip rap bank protection and seeding of the channel slopes and filter strips. This project is under construction and is 96 % complete on the clearing and 50% complete on the dredging.

It now appears there may be funds available to do additional work in the watershed to further improve drainage. It is best to do additional work on this channel while the contractor is in place, which will not incur additional mobilization costs.

Proposed extension of the Reconstruction Project from 191st to 196th Street

Several landowners within the Stony Creek / Locke Arm watershed appeared before the Drainage Board at the February 14, 2011 Drainage Board Meeting requesting additional work to be performed on the Stony Creek / Locke Arm, south of the approved reconstruction project. The landowners stated that the approved Stony Creek / Locke Arm reconstruction would be less effective at draining the watershed if there were remaining flow line obstructions south of 196th Street. (See Drainage Board Meeting Minutes, Book 13, pages 274-278) The Drainage Board agreed to hold a public hearing on this additional work on April 25th, 2011.

I reviewed the Stony Creek / Locke Arm channel, south of 196th Street and witnessed beaver dams, sediment, and rock obstructions. The channel south of 191st Street to 186th Street has been personally maintained by owner Melvin Hair. It is in excellent condition and I do not feel any improvements are required in this area. The Stony Creek Channel from 186th Street to SR 32 was approved in the original reconstruction hearing for cleaning and removal of flow line obstructions.

The area of the proposed additional dredging is located between 191st Street and 196th Street. The clearing of trees will take place along the west side of the drain to facilitate an operation side for the equipment needed for the dredging. This will create a side for future maintenance. This clearing was previously approved as Change Order No.1 by the Drainage Board on March 14th, 2011 for \$22,000.

The proposed additional dredging will begin on the north side of 191^{st} , at Station 244+90 on the proposed reconstruction plans. It will extend to the south side of 196^{th} Street at Station 212 +82 on the proposed reconstruction plans. An average of 1 to 1.5 feet of sediment will be removed from the channel as well as beaver dams and other flow line obstructions. The width of the proposed channel bottom stays the same at approximately 20 feet plus or minus.

A fence gate will be installed to allow mowing of the filter strip along the Harger property. One rock line chute will be installed to reduce velocity of a side channel. Surface water pipes will be installed as needed.

Shown on the plans is the placement of a twenty foot (20') filter strip along the operational side of the drain in the agricultural land uses. This shall be considered as part of the reconstruction of the drain. The filter strip is part of the IDEM approval for this project. The filter strip shall affect the following properties:

Hydrology, Design and Environmental Permits

A watershed management plan was prepared by Christopher Burke Engineering in 2004 to 2005. This report provided recommendations to the Drainage Board for maintenance, reconstruction and flood control.

The channel is designed to contain the 10 year storm frequency within the banks at all locations.

The additional reconstruction of this drain will not require acquisition of new easement for the entire length of the drain. The drain is being reconstructed in place and the existing 75 foot easement from the top of bank per IC 36-9-27-33 will be maintained. No additional easement acquisition will be required since the spoils of the project will be spread within the existing easement.

The following regulatory approval has been obtained:

- U.S. Army Crop of Engineers Regional General Permit IDNR. LRL-2009-131-sam, December 29, 2009 (Valid for 1 year)
- IDEM Section 401 Water Quality Certification No. 2009-583-29-EMP-A, December 21, 2009 (Valid for 2 years)
- IDNR Certificate of Approval, Construction in a floodway FW-25553, January 20, 2010 (Valid for 2 years)
- Soil and Water Conservation District SWPPP approval July 28, 2009

The U.S. Army Corp of Engineers permit and the IDEM permit is scheduled to expire the end of this year. Therefore, time is of the essence to finalize this work.

Quantities & Cost Estimate

The cost estimate for this work is as follows. The unit prices were taken from the Van Horn Contract Bid for the original reconstruction project and Wetland Staking costs from Christopher Burke and Associates.

The Hamilton County Drainage Board held a public hearing on May 24^{th} , 2010 regarding a proposed reconstruction project known as the Stony Creek Drain / Locke Arm. Your property is listed on the schedule of assessments which will start in the spring of 2011. The original hearing held on 5/24/10 had a cost estimate of \$1,372,295.00. The Drainage Board received 11.67% objections to the project. After listening to the objections the Board adjourned the hearing to the 26^{th} of July.

At the July 26th 2010 Drainage Board meeting six (6) options were presented. Option #6 was approved with a cost estimate of \$556,151.50. The assessments were reduced to the revised cost estimate. Assessments under \$100 have been certified to start collections in 2011. Assessments over \$100 have been split and the first half will start collections in 2011 and the second half will start collections in 2012. The Board issued an order declaring the proposed improvement established. Such findings and order were marked filed and are available for inspection in the Office of the Hamilton County Surveyor.


