During 1979 a survey was made on the J.I. Teter Drain by the Hamilton County Soil Conservation Services office. The survey showed the need for a reconstruction on this drain. A design was completed and after considering the situation I believe that at this time a reconstruction should be made on the main portion of the drain and the work needed for Arm #2 be done at a later time under maintenance.

The work done on reconstruction would be construction of Structures 1, 2, 4 and dredging and reshaping banks on 3600 feet of the open ditch as per S6S plans and specifications.

The cost estimate for the reconstruction is as follows:

Upon reviewing the bids for the James I. Teter Drain, I have come to the conclusion that the estimate which I prepared was low. After considering the matter I believe the best method for solving the problem is to reassess the landowners at the October Drainage Board meeting. I have talked to Ray Wood of J & W Excavating, Inc. and he has told me that his bid of \$17,148.12, which was the low base bid, will remain the same.

At this time Alternates A and B should be held off till a future date.

By using \$17,150.00 the cost per acre is \$20.22. If the reassessment passess in October the reconstruction could be finished this year.

On August 10, 1981 I made a final inspection on the J.T. Teter Drain reconstruction done by J & W Excavating, Inc. At this time I found the work to be finished and acceptable. There was a change in the contract which lowered the contract price. Structure #2 was omitted which took \$1005.58 from the contract price of \$13,724.24 leaving \$12,718.66 as the new contract price. At this time 85% or \$10,810.87 has been paid to the contractor leaving 15% or \$1,907.79 to be paid. Along with a claim for extra work (dredging) in the amount of \$525.58.

Claims for extra work ordered that have been paid are as follows:


