Re: Thorpe Creek Drain, Cyntheanne Extension

Attached is a drain map, drainage shed map and schedule of assessments for the extension of the Thorpe Creek Drain. This proposed drain is located in Fall Creek Township.

I have made a personal inspection of the land described below. Upon doing so, I believe that the drain is practicable, will improve the public health, benefit a public highway and be of public utility and that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed drain will probably be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of land likely to be benefited. The drain will consist of the following:

Open Ditch 2,060 ft.

The total length of the drain will be 2,060 feet.

The extension will begin at the north line of tract 13-12-30-00-010.000. The extension will follow the existing open ditch downstream to the south property line of the above mentioned tract.

The current rates for the Thorpe Creek Drain are \$5.00 per acre with a \$15.00 minimum for agricultural and unplatted residential. However, a proposal is before the Board to reduce the rates to \$2.00 per acre for these land uses. The annual maintenance collection for this extension will be \$170.20 if the proposed reduction in rates is approved.

I believe this proposed drain meets the requirements for Urban Drain Classification as set out in IC 36-9-27-67 to 69. Therefore, this drain shall be designated as an Urban Drain. The nature of maintenance work required is as follows:

- 1. Bank erosion protection and/or seeding as might be required;
- 2. Removal of debris and/or blockages from existing open drain;
- 3. Removal of beaver dams;
- 4. Any other repairs necessary to restore proper flow to the open ditch.

The frequency with which maintenance work should be performed is annually as required by the condition of the drain.

The easements for the drain should be set at 75' from top of bank as set out in IC 36-9-27-33. Additional drainage easement will be added to the following tracts:

I recommend that the Board set a hearing for this proposal for March 26, 2007.

FINDINGS AND ORDER FOR RECONSTRUCTION

The matter of the proposed Reconstruction of the **Thorpe Creek Drain**, **Cyntheanne Extension** came before the Hamilton County Drainage Board for hearing **on March 26**, **2007**, on the Reconstruction Report consisting of the report and the Schedule of Damages and Assessments. The Board also received and considered the written objection of an owner of certain lands affected by the proposed Reconstruction, said owner being:

The Board, having considered the evidence and objections, and, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did find and determine that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed Reconstruction will be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of all land benefited by the Reconstruction.

The Board having considered the evidence and objections, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did adopt the Schedule of Assessments as proposed, subject to amendment after inspection of the subject drain as it relates to the lands of any owners which may have been erroneously included or omitted from the Schedule of Assessments.

The Board further finds that it has jurisdiction of these proceedings and that all required notices have been duly given or published as required by law.

Wherefore, it is ORDERED, that the proposed Reconstruction of the **Thorpe Creek Drain**, **Cyntheanne Extension** be and is hereby declared established.

Thereafter, the Board made inspection for the purpose of determining whether or not the lands of any owners had been erroneously included or excluded from the Schedule of Assessments. The Board finds on the basis of the reports and findings at this hearing as follows:
