After a careful investigation of the condition of said proposed Drain, we are of the opinion that said Drain should be constructed and in the manner set out in this report and that the same when completed will improve the Public health and will reclaim certain lands, and will be a public utility, and will benefit highways, also that the cost of Constructing, damages and expense of effecting said Drain will be less than the benefits to the lands effected by said Drainage.

That we definately determined the best and cheapest method of effecting the drainage of such lands, we have fixed the route, location and character of said proposed work and have fixed the same by metes and bounds, coarses, descriptions and guides and Bench Marks, for a complete outles for the drainage of said lands effected by said proposed work; that we divided the ditch into sections of not more than 100

The work will be staked out by the Engineer and his stakes must be carefully preserve and followed. The digging of each and every portion of the Ditch must be at its outlet, or its junction with another tile drain towards its upper end.

The ditch to be dug along one side of the line of survey stakes, and sufficient distance from to not disturbe them, and shall be dug in a straight and clean manner. In taking out the last draft the blade of the spade must not go deeper than the grade line. The Ditch must be dug accurately and true to the grade at the depth indicated by the figures given by the Engineer, measured from the grade stakes.

The lapingof the tile must begin at the lower end and proceed up stream.

The tile must be laid as closely as practicable and in a line free from crocks, the piece being turned about until the upper closes, unless there is sand or fine silt which is likely to run into the tile, in which case the lower edge must be laid close and the upper side covered with clay or other material.

When making turns or by other unvoidable reasons a crack of one-fourth (1) inch or more is necessarily left, it must be securely covered with broken pieces of tile or by other instructable material, junctions with branch lines must be carefully and securely made.

Such Bonds shall be issued for the principal of the assessments for costs after the time has expired according to this order for the payment of cash and said cash paysments collected by the county Treusurer have been deducted from the total costs assessment. The Bond shall bear interest at the rateoofc6% per annum, to be computed from

the final order for their issue which interest shall be paid semi-annually as herein provided.

BOND ORDINANCE

In the matter of the Fred E. Hines, et al., Petition for Drain.

Comes now the petitioners herein, and submits to the Board of Commissioners of Hamilton County, State of Indiana, the certificate of the Treasurer of said county, heretofore filed showing the total amount remaining unpaid on the assessments of said drain, in the sum of \$\frac{\xi}{2}\frac{1468.08}{2}\frac{1}{2}\text{and}\$ asks that bonds be issued and sold for said amount to pay the balance of the cost of the construction of said drain.

Therefore, be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of Hamilton County, State of Indiana, that said County by and through its Board of Commissioners, borrow the sum of \$1468.08..., for the purpose of paying the balance due for the construction of said drain, as provided by law, and that in order to procure said loan that the bonds of said county be issued to the amount of \$1468.08..., bearing interest/payable semi-annually, evidenced by coupons for such interest, the same to be signed by thee Board of Commissioners and attested by the Auditor of said County, and sealed with the seal of said County, and that said bonds be issued in denominations, as follows:

The first bond to be issued in the principal sum of \$154.08 and shall be due and payable on the 10th day of May:1930 the remaining nine bonds shall be issued in denominations of \$146.00, each, the first one of which shall be due and payable on the 10th day of May:1931, and thereafter one bond shall fall due and become payable on the 10th day of May, of each and every year thereafter until all of said bonds are paid.

That said bonds shall bear the dute of the 20th day of December, 1929, and interest thereon shall be payable on the toth day of May and the loth day of November, of each year until all of said bonds are paid.
