The following is submitted to the Board for approval and as a request to set a date for a hearing of the project.

This is a joint effort of the Hamilton County Surveyor Office and the Soil Conservation Services as to repairing the ditch and placing it in proper working order in the best and lest expensive way.

The Waltz and Mehan Drain is to be cleaned of excisive silt and bank; stablized. A flat grade from the crossing back to 50ft above Y with the Herman Morris Drain is to be maintained.

The lower 400ft of the Herman Morris Drain is to be opened. Grade is set by the bottom of the tile. The tile is to be opened from just a few feet West of the cluster of trees to its connection with the Waltz and Mehan Ditch.

A metal half-moon overfall structure is to be placed at the above mentioned starting point. This structure is to meet the specification of the Soil Conservation Services office and installed by their method.

Where the tile traverses the woods of John A Applegate, the trees are to be cleared so as not to cause any future problem to the drain.
