Re: Westfield Farms Drain, U.S. 31 Relocation

Attached is the petition and plans for the U.S. 31 Relocation of the Westfield Farms Drain. The relocation is being proposed by the Indiana Department of Transportation. This proposed relocated drain is located in Clay and Washington Townships. The proposal is to intercept the Westfield Farms Drain, Greyhound Pass and Village Arm and relocate it along the west side of U.S. 31 to south of 146th Street, then cross under U.S. 31 to detention facilities in the interchange of U.S. 31 and Keystone Parkway, with a final discharge point being Cool Creek between the Keystone Parkway Bridges. This work is shown in the U.S. 31 Hamilton County Plans by R.W. Armstrong, with INDOT Project Number 0600438 (Segment 5) pages 166, 168, 170, 183, 185, 196 to 199, and 239, and INDOT Project Number 0900269 (Segment 7), pages 49 and 199.

This line will consist of the following: New Str. 607 (on the Segment 7 plans) being set 18 feet east of existing Str. 27 on the Greyhound Pass and Village Arm, to Str. 605, to Str. 598, to Str. 592, to Str. 585b (of the Segment 5 plans), then to Str. 578, to Str. 566, to Str. 561b, to Str. 561c, to Str. 556b, to Str. 554, to the end section, then 390 of open ditch to Str 628 (outlet 14B), then 86 feet of open ditch to Str. 629 (outlet 14C), then 9 feet of open ditch to Str. 744 (outlet 14D), then 396 feet of open ditch to Outlet 14F, then 168 feet of open drain ending at the intersection with Cool Creek between the Keystone Parkway Bridges. The footages below describe the drain:

The total length of new tile shall be 3,690 feet. The 3,340 feet of the original drain between new Str. 607 per the U.S. 31 Segment 7 plans, which is approximately 18 feet east of existing Str. 27 of the Greyhound Pass and Village Arm, per my report dated May 19, 2000 and approved by the Board at hearing on May 22, 2000 (See Hamilton County Drainage Board Minutes Book 5, Pages 374-375), and the intersection of the Lowes Extension, per my report dated April 23, 2001 and approved by the Board at hearing on June 25, 2001 (See Hamilton County Drainage Board Minutes Book 6, Pages 72-74) with Cool Creek shall be vacated. This proposal will add an additional 350 feet to the drains total length. Part of the open ditch footage listed above is a flow line through INDOT detention basins 14B (390 feet), 14C (86 feet), 14D (9 feet), and 14F (396 feet) near the Keystone Parkway and U.S. 31 interchange, as shown on the plans for Segment 5 plans. The detention basins are not to be considered part of the regulated drain. Only the inlet, outlet, and flow path through the basins, will be maintained as part of the regulated drain. The maintenance of the detention basin will be the responsibility of INDOT. The Board however will retain jurisdiction for ensuring the storage volume for which the detention basins were designed will be retained. Thereby, allowing no fill or easement encroachments.

The petitioner was not required to post a Performance Bond, as this is a State of Indiana funded project.

The cost of the relocation is to be paid by Indiana Department of Transportation as part of the U.S. 31 project.

The easement for this new drain shall be 75 feet from the center line of pipe or top of bank of the drain as outlined in IC 36-9-27-33. The easement will fall within U.S. 31 Right of Way from the confluence with Cool Creek up to 146th Street. From 146th Street north to Str. 607, the easement is being added or moved on the following parcels:

The relocation of this drain will be in future U.S. 31 Right of Way, after INDOT completes acquisition of the property during the ROW purchase process. It will be up to INDOT to make sure the ownership of the land is complete and the easement locations are acceptable to the adjoining property owners prior to beginning construction on the relocation of the drain.

I recommend that the Board set a hearing for this proposed reconstruction/relocation for May 29, 2012.

On this 29th day of May, 2012, the Hamilton County Drainage Board has held a hearing on the Maintenance Report and Schedule of Assessments of the Westfield Farms Drain, U.S. 31 Relocation, Between New Structure 607 and 18' east of Existing Structure 27 of the Greyhound Pass & Village Arm (Per Segment 7 of the U.S. 31 Plans) & Intersection of the Lowes Extension.

FINDINGS AND ORDER FOR RECONSTRUCTION

The matter of the proposed Reconstruction of the **Westfield Farms** Drain, U.S. 31 Relocation came before the Hamilton County Drainage Board for hearing on May 29, 2012, on the Reconstruction Report consisting of the report and the Schedule of Damages and Assessments. The Board also received and considered the written objection of an owner of certain lands affected by the proposed Reconstruction, said owner being:

Evidence was heard on the Reconstruction Report and on the aforementioned objections.

The Board, having considered the evidence and objections, and, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did find and determine that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed Reconstruction will be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of all land benefited by the Reconstruction.

The Board having considered the evidence and objections, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did adopt the Schedule of Assessments as proposed, subject to amendment after inspection of the subject drain as it relates to the lands of any owners which may have been erroneously included or omitted from the Schedule of Assessments.

The Board further finds that it has jurisdiction of these proceedings and that all required notices have been duly given or published as required by law.

Wherefore, it is ORDERED, that the proposed Reconstruction of the **Westfield Farms Drain**, **U.S. 31 Relocation** be and is hereby declared established.

Thereafter, the Board made inspection for the purpose of determining whether or not the lands of any owners had been erroneously included or excluded from the Schedule of Assessments. The Board finds on the basis of the reports and findings at this hearing as follows:


