Attached is a petition, non-enforcement request, plans, calculations, quantity summary and assessment roll for the Kingsmill, Section 1 Arm of the John Osborn Drain. I have reviewed the submittals and petition and have found each to be in proper form.

I have made a personal inspection of the land described in the petition. Upon doing so, I believe that the drain is practicable; will improve the public health; benefit a public highway and be of public utility; and that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed drain will probably be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of land likely to be benefited. The drain will consist of the following:

6" SSD 7748 feet 21" RCP 190 feet 12" RCP 560 feet 24" RCP 392 feet 15" RCP 164 feet 27" RCP 87 feet 18" RCP 911 feet

The total length of the drain will be 10,052 feet.

The retention pond (lake) located in Block C is not to be considered part of the regulated drain. Only the inlet and outlet will be maintained as part of the regulated drain. The maintenance of the pond (lake) will be the responsibility of the Homeowners Association. The Board will however, retain jurisdiction for ensuring the storage volume for which the lake was designed will be retained. Thereby, allowing no fill or easement encroachments.

The subsurface drains (SSD) to be part of the regulated drain are those located under the curbs and those main lines between lots or in rear yards. Only the main SSD lines which are located within the easement/right of way are to be maintained as regulated drain. Laterals for individual lots will not be considered part of the regulated drain.

I have reviewed the plans and believe the drain will benefit each lot equally. Therefore, I recommend each lot be assessed equally. I also believe that no damages will result to landowners by the construction of this drain. I recommend a maintenance assessment of \$25.00 per lot, \$2.00 per acre for roadways, with a \$25.00 minimum. With this assessment the total annual assessment for this section will be \$828,44

Parcels assessed for this drain may be assessed for the Williams Creek, Osborn-Collins or Springmill Run Drains at sometime in the future. Lots 41, 42, 43 1, 3 and 4, assessed for this drain will also be assessed for the Fitch and Jessup Drain.

I believe this proposed drain meets the requirements for Urban Drain Classification as set out in IC 36-9-27-67 to 69. Therefore, this drain shall be designated as an Urban Drain.

I recommend that upon approval of the above proposed drain that the Board also approve the attached non-enforcement request. This request is for the reduction of the regulated drain easement to those easement widths as shown on the secondary plat for Kingsmill Section 1 as recorded in the office of the Hamilton County Recorder.

I recommend the Board set a hearing for this proposed drain for February 1995.

Petitioner is the owner of all lots in the land affected by the proposed new regulated drain. The drainage will affect various lots in Kingsmill, a subdivision in Hamilton County, Indiana. The general route of such drainage shall be in existing easements and along public roads as shown in the plans on file in the Surveyor's Office.

Petitioner believes that the cost, damages and expenses of the proposed improvement will be less than the benefits which will result to the owners of the land likely to be benefited thereby. Petetioner believes the proposed improvements will:

- (a) improve public health
- (b) benefit a public street
- (c) be of public utility

Petitioner agrees to pay the cost of construction of the drainage system and requests periodic maintenance assessments by the Board thereafter.

The Petitioner also agrees to the following:

- 1. To provide the Drainage Board a Performance Bond for the portion of the drainage system which will be made a regulated drain. The bond will be in the amount of 100% of the Engineers estimate. The bond will be in effect until construction of 100% of the system is completed and so certified by the Engineer.
- 2. The Petitioner shall retain an Engineer throughout the construction phase. At completion of the project the Petitioner's Engineer shall certify that the drainage system which is to be maintained as a regulated drain has been constructed as per construction plans.

- 3. The Petitioner agrees to request in writing to the County Surveyor any changes from the approved plan and must receive written authorization from the County Surveyor prior to implementation of the change. All changes shall be documented and given to the Surveyor to be placed in the Drain File.
- 4. The Petitioner shall instruct his Engineer to provide a reproducable print on a 24" x 36" mylar of 'the final design of the Drainage System. This shall be submitted to the County Surveyor prior to the release of the Performance Bond.
- 5. The Petitioner shall comply with the Erosion Control Plan as as specified on the construction plans. Failure to comply with the Erosion Control Plan shall be determined by the Board as being an obstruction to the drainage system. The County Surveyor shall immediately install or repair the needed measures at Petitioners cost as per IC 36-9-27-46.

The Petitioner further requests that the Drain be classified as an Urban Drain.



Attached are as-builts, certificate of completion & compliance, and other information for Kingsmill Section 1. An inspection of the drainage facilities for this section has been made and the facilities were found to be complete and acceptable.

During construction, changes were made to the drain which will alter the plans submitted with my report for this drain dated December 20, 1994. The changes are as follows:

STR 115-114 consists of 12" RCP which was shortened from 29' feet to 26' feet. STR 121-107 consists of 18" RCP which was lengthened from 300' feet to 330' feet. STR 107-122 consists of 18" RCP which was lengthened from 300' feet to 330' feet.

The length of the drain due to the changes described above is now 10.109 feet.

The non-enforcement was approved by the Board at its meeting on February 29, 1995.

The bond or letter of credit from National City Bank, number #44333 for erosion control and #44306 for storm sewer, dated September 7, 1994 and July 25, 1994, in the amounts of \$12,900.00 and \$114,400 have been released.

I recommend the Board approve the drains construction as complete and acceptable.
