RE: Williams Creek Drain, Springmill Road – 131st Street to Williams Creek Reconstruction

Attached are petition, plans, and other information for the proposed reconstruction of the Williams Creek Drain, for the Springmill Road project from 131st Street to Williams Creek north crossing. The reconstruction was petitioned by the City of Carmel. During this construction several arms of the Williams Creek Drain will be affected. Those changes are as follows:

#### Williams Creek Drain

Williams Creek Drain – Springmill Ridge Section 2 Arm: The project will remove 38 feet of 15" RCP between Str. 628 and the end section (Str. 629), per the original plans. Thus, 38 feet of drain will be removed from the Williams Creek Drain – Springmill Ridge Section 2 Arm. This is shown on Sheet 52 of the plans prepared by United Consulting, having City of Carmel Project Number 16-ENG-52, dated August 16, 2016.

Williams Creek Drain – Springmill Ridge Section 1 Arm: The existing end section, Str. 611 per the original plans, will be removed and new manhole, Str. 321 will be set on the end of the regulated drain. Also to be removed is 50 feet of 12" CMP pipe under Springmill Road from Str. 615 to Str. 616 per the original plans. This pipe falls at approximately Sta. 503+50 of the road plans. Thus, 50 feet of drain will be removed from the Williams Creek Drain – Springmill Ridge Section 1Arm. This is shown on Sheet 50 of the plans prepared by United Consulting, having City of Carmel Project Number 16-ENG-52, dated August 16, 2016.

<u>Williams Creek Drain – Westpark at Springmill Section 1 Arm:</u> The project will remove 38 feet of open ditch, 45 feet of 12" CMP, and 94 feet of open ditch between Str. 761 of the original plans and Williams Creek. This will be replaced with the end section, Str. 761 of the original

plans, being replaced with new Str. 304 of the road plans. From there is 38 feet of 18" RCP to Str. 303A and then 85 feet of 18" RCP to the end section, then 30 feet of open ditch to Williams Creek flowline. Thus, 177 feet of original drain will be replaced with 153 feet of new drain, resulting in a 24 foot change to the Williams Creek Drain — Westpark at Springmill Section 1 Arm. This is shown on Sheet 49 of the plans prepared by United Consulting, having City of Carmel Project Number 16-ENG-52, dated August 16, 2016.

<u>Williams Creek – Main Channel:</u> With this project, 140 feet of open ditch, which is the main Williams Creek channel, from the west right of way line to the east right of way line of Springmill Road at Bridge Str. 31, will be added to the Williams Creek Regulated Drain. This is shown on Sheet 49 of the plans prepared by United Consulting, having City of Carmel Project Number 16-ENG-52, dated August 16, 2016.

The road project will add 28 feet to the Williams Creek Drain and all affected arms.

The cost of the reconstruction is to be paid by the City of Carmel.

This project will perform work on the following parcels:

No changes will be made to the current regulated drain easements on the above parcels with this project. New regulated drain easement will be created within Springmill Road Right of Way with this project.

I recommend that the Board set a hearing to consider this watershed boundary change for October 24, 2016.

#### FINDINGS AND ORDER FOR RECONSTRUCTION

The matter of the proposed Reconstruction of the Williams Creek Drain, Springmill Road - 131<sup>st</sup> Street to Williams Creek Reconstruction came before the Hamilton County Drainage Board for hearing on October 24 2016, on the Reconstruction Report consisting of the report and the Schedule of Damages and Assessments. The Board also received and considered the written objection of an owner of certain lands affected by the proposed Reconstruction, said owner being:

Evidence was heard on the Reconstruction Report and on the aforementioned objections.

The Board, having considered the evidence and objections, and, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did find and determine that the costs, damages and expenses of the proposed Reconstruction will be less than the benefits accruing to the owners of all land benefited by the Reconstruction.

The Board having considered the evidence and objections, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, did adopt the Schedule of Assessments as proposed, subject to amendment after inspection of the subject drain as it relates to the lands of any owners which may have been erroneously included or omitted from the Schedule of Assessments.

The Board further finds that it has jurisdiction of these proceedings and that all required notices have been duly given or published as required by law.

Wherefore, it is ORDERED, that the proposed Reconstruction of the Williams Creek Drain, Springmill Road -  $131^{st}$  Street to Williams Creek Reconstruction be and is hereby declared established.

Thereafter, the Board made inspection for the purpose of determining whether or not the lands of any owners had been erroneously included or excluded from the Schedule of Assessments. The Board finds on the basis of the reports and findings at this hearing as follows:


The Board issued an order declaring the proposed improvement established. Such findings and order were marked filed and are available for inspection in the Office of the Hamilton County Surveyor.

Re: Williams Creek Drain: Springmill Rd – 131st to Williams Creek Reconstruction

Attached are plans, and other information for Springmill  $Rd-131^{st}$  to Williams Creek Reconstruction. An inspection of the drainage facilities for this section has been made and the facilities were found to be complete and acceptable.

During construction, changes were made to the drain, which will alter the plans submitted with my report for this drain-dated August 30,2016. The report was approved by the Board at the hearing held October 24, 2016. (See DRB 17, Pages 165-167) The changes are as follows: there was a separate final report written for the Westpark at Springmill Section 1 Arm of the JR Collins # 1 Drain, dated June 16, 2020. There was 38 feet of existing 15" RCP removed with Springmill Ridge Sec. 2. There was 50 feet of 12" CMP was removed with Springmill Ridge Section 1. The project also regulated 140 feet of Williams Creek under Springmill Rd. The length of the drain due to the changes described above is now **52 feet** of additional drain to the overall watershed.

I recommend the Board approve the drain's construction as complete and acceptable.
