

RE: L.V. Wright Drain

On February 16, 1989 the Tipton County Drainage Board approved the reconstruction of the L.V. Wright or George Sowers-J.A. Brown Drain. The Hamilton County Drainage Board had waived its right to a joint Board concerning this matter on March 7, 1988 making Tipton County the Board of Record. The work was completed on or around August 17, 1989 by Chuck Johnson, Inc. for a total of \$173,519.53. The work was inspected by the Tipton County Surveyor and approved by the Tipton County Drainage Board.

On March 16, 1988 I requested the Tipton County Surveyor to include in his report the vacation of the original tile from Station 0 to Station 19+00, which is the County line. This portion of the tile is in Hamilton County and is described in the original report for the L.V. Wright Drain dated October 1902. This tile was replaced by the existing open ditch, probably in 1958.

In October, 1989, I found the Tipton County Surveyor did not include abandonment of the tile portion of the drain in his report to the Board. In November 1989, I asked the Tipton County Drainage Board for a waiver concerning the tile abandonment in Hamilton County. On January 16, 1990, the Tipton County Drainage Board approved the waiver of Joint Board in this matter.

I recommend the Hamilton County Drainage Board vacate the L.V. Wright Drain from Station 0+70 to Station 19+00of the original description. Station 0+70 of the original drain is the same as Station 190+74 of the 1989 project. The vacation would affect the old tile protion in Hamilton County only and not the existing open ditch. The eighteen (18") inch tile drain from Station 0 to Station 0+70 of the original report (190+04 to 190+74 of the 1989 report) will remain as regualted drain. I believe only Hamilton County residents are affected and recommend only Hamilton County residents be notified. This by no means will alter the current reconstruction nor maintenance programs.

I recommend the Board set a hearing for this matter in April 1990.

REVIEWERS' REPORT OF LHWIS V. WRICHT ET AL DITCH.
TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF TIPTON AND HARLLTON COUNTYS,
INDIANA:--

We, the undersigned, appointed by this court, at the March Regular Term , 1903, to review a drain described in the certified copy of a patition and order of court for a ditch, by Lowis V. Wright, George + & W. Sowers et al , handed us by the Auditor, together with a plat of the said proposed drain, including an acurate survey by the engineer, and the original viewers' report, would represent that according to said order, we on the day named thoreinto, to-wit:- the 24" day of March 1902, in company with II L. Findley a civil engineer, we proceeded to review the said proposed drain as laid out and located by the original viewers, from its source to its outlet, including their survey by the engineer. We also made a pomputtation of the total number of cubic yards of earth to be removed from said drain and estimated the total cost for the construction of the work to be the same as shown in the original viewers 2668 report, to-wit: "See Exhibit B".

We have also set out by a statement below, the names of the owners of lands benefited, with a description of each tract of land, and amount assessed against each tract. The depth of cut, the width at bottom, and width at top along said drain, as also shown in a tabular statement in this report. After a full and careful review and examination, we are of the opinion that the drain, as located by said original survey will be of public utility and a benefit to the neighborhood and that along the first of said drain there are large tracts of wet line that will be rendered more fertile and we believe that the cost of the constitution of said frain will be less than the benefits to be derived therefrom, and that the best method to accomplish said drainage is as follows.

#### DESCRIPTION.

By the construction of a drain commencing at a point 1006 foot south of the northeast corner of the northwest quarter of Section three (3), Township Twenty (20) north, Range four (4) east, Hamilton County, Indiana, run thence N. 58 1/2° E. 2100 feet, thence N. 29° E. 1300 feet, thence N. 41° E. 100 feet, thence N. 62° 30° E. 100 feet, thence N. 70° E. 1145 feet, thence N. 55° E. 1065 feet, thence East 490 feet, thence N. 50° E. 1200 feet, thence N. 65° E. 400 feet, thence N. 70° E. 400 feet, thence N. 70° E. 600 feet, thence East 400 feet, thence N. 70° E. 400 feet, thence N. 80° E. 1000 feet, thence N. 70° E. 400 feet, thence N. 80° E. 1000 feet, thence N. 70° E. 400 feet, thence N. 80° E. 1000 feet, thence N. 85° E. 700 feet, thence S. 32° E. 700 feet and terminating 700 feet west and 120 feet north of the southeast corner of the northeast quarter of Section 36. Township 21 north, Range four (4) east, Tipton County, Indiana.

Also an arm beginning at a point 440 feet west and 20 feet north of the southeast corner of the west half of the southwest quarter of section 35, Township 21 north, Range four (4) east, Tipton County, Indiana, run thouce N. 50° E. 626 feet, thence North 1134 feet and terminating on Main Ditch at station 47 + 45 at a point 1520 feet north of the last above named corner.

#### REQUIREMENTS.

Hain Ditch to consist on one row of 1# tile from stake 0 to stake 3/4/4 and one row od 16 tile from stake 3/4/4 to stake 47 + 45 and one row of 34" tile from stake 47 + 45 to stake 56 + 94 and one row of 24" salt glazed sewer tile from stake 56 + 94 to stake 57 + 10.

At stake 57 + 10 or end of tile there shall be a stone retaining wall 2'x 6'x 18' built of niger heads or ruble stone laid up in mortar made from on part Portland Cement to three parts good sharp sand, so constructed as to receive the tile at the established grade and at least 18" above the base of the wall.

The remaining portion of Main Ditch from stake 57 + 10 to stake 148 to be an open drain 18" wide at bottom with side slopes 45° as far as practicable.

The arm or branch to consist of one row of 16" tile from stake 0 to stake 17 + 70 or its entire length, and to be connected to Main Ditch at stake 47+ 55 with a wye sewer tile connection 18" X 24".

From stake 17 + 50 to stake 17 + 70 shall be laid in a regular curve so as to make proper connection with main ditch.

All tile used in the construction of this ditch shall be first class in every respect laid in the ditch in a true line at the proper grade with joints well matched and shall be left uncovered until inspected and accepted by the engineer in charge after being accepted the trench of Ditch over and along the line of the tile shall be filled with earth to a depth of not less than 24° over the tile where the ditch runs in the old open channel and where the ditch is new cut the trench to be filled full.

All work to be done in a first class workmanlike manner and to the full satisfaction of the engineer.

The fall of the established grade of main Ditch from Stake 0 to stake 45 is 6/100 feet to each 100 feet; from stake 45 to stake 57 + 10 is 8/100 feet, to each 100 feet; at stake 57 + 10 or at end of tile a drop in grade of 35/100 feet; from stake 57 + 10 to stake 127 is 8/100 feet to each 100 feet; and from stake 127 to stake 148 is 15/100 feet to each 100 feet.

The fall of the established grade of the Arm Brom O to Station 174 70 is 6/100 feet to each 100 feet.

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We the Review ers would further report that on our opinion it would be impracticable to allot this ditch for construction for the reason that the work can be done in less time, and at less cost, and to a better advantage if sold to the lowest and best bidder; and we recommend that the ditch be sold in accordance with the law made and provided in such cases.
