Attached is a proposed plan for reconstructing the northern or upper portion of the Jacob Yansel Drain.

Upon investigation I have found that the existing 6" tile on the Clifford Williams property is entirely nonfunctioning. I believe there are two factors contributing to this problem. One is the fact that the 8" tile at the south fence line of the Williamson property is higher than the low area which the 6" tile ran through. I also believe that the tile was put in at a shallow depth and because of this freezing action, the heavy equipment and deeper plow depths has destroyed this portion of the tile.

I believe that the 6 " tile from Sta 0 to Sta 15+00 of the Yansel Drain be abandoned and the proposed Arms 1 and 2 be constructed.

Arm 1 should begin at a point 450 feet west and 950 feet south of the northeast corner of section 5-19-4 then running S 60° E in a 10" tile 600 feet to a point on a fence line approximately 1300 feet south and 130 feet east of the above said corner. Said point is a breather where Arm 2 intersects

Arm 1. Thence in a 10" tile 500 feet S 20° E to another breather in a fence line approximately 1700 feet south and 300 feet east of the above named corner. Thence S 25° E 700 feet to a catch basin at Sta 27+50 on the main ditch.

Arm 2 to begin 350 feet east and 600 feet south of the northwest corner of section 4-19-4. Thence 800 feet in a southwesterely direction in an 8" tile to the intersection with Arm 1. This cost estimate for the porposed work is as follows:

At this time the Jacob Yansel Drain is 85% complete. I have checked the work which is finished to date and found it to be acceptable. Work yet to be completed is 1.) Finish backfilling Arm #2 2.) French Drain on Arm #2 and 3.) placing caps on Breathers-which is extra work.

Extra work on this project is the Breather Caps and replacing 220' of 8inch tile which was cut installing the new tile. The cost for the extra work comes to \$631.50. A claim for the extra work and 85% of the contract, which is \$4445.50, should be approved for payment for July 6th, 1982.

A description of the new tile is as follows:

The Arm #1 of the Jacob Yansel Drain as reconstructed in 1982 begins at STA 18, 850' South and 300' East of the NorthEast corner of Section 5, Township 19, Range 4. Thence 600' in a curve to the South West to a Catch Basin at STA 12+00, approximately 1500' South and 125' West of the above said corner. Thence in a South SouthEast direction 1200' to a Catch Basin located 500' East and 600' North of the SouthWest corner of the NorthEast quarter of Section 5, Township 19, Range 4. Said Catch Basin being STA 0 of the reconstruction and STA 27+50 of the Jacob Yansel

On September 27th I made the final inspection on the reconstruction of the Yansel Drain. At this time I found the work to be complete and acceptable.


