TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF

Hamilton

COUNTY, INDIANA:

We, the undersigned, appointed by this Court, at its December Term, 1889, to view a drain described in the certified copy of a petition and order of Court for a Ditch, by Martha A. Darroo and others.

handed us by the Auditor, would represent that according to said order we, on the day named therein to-wit: the 20th day

of January, 1890, in company with L. J. Battieghorn, a civil engineer, made an accurate survey of the line of said proposed Ditch

from its source to its outlet. A plat of said Ditch is filed herewith

including the survey by the engineer, marked "Exhibit ." We caused stakes to be set along said line, each one hundred feet, numbering down stream, as shown by plat. We also made a computation of the total number of cubic yards of earth to be removed from said drain, and estimated the total cost for the construction of the work at

Dollars. We also

apportioned and set apart to each parcel of land a share of said work in proportion to the benefits received, all of which will fully appear by a tabular statement in this report. We have also set out by a statement below, the names of the owners of lands benefited with a description of each tract of land, and the amount assessed against each tract. The depth of cut, the width at bottom, and width at top along said drain is also shown in a tabular statement in this report. After a full and careful view and examination, we are of the opinion that the drain as located by the survey will be of Public Utility, a benefit to health, and benefits two

public Highways, and that the benefits will be greater than the cost of construction, and should be located and constructed as follows:

Main Ditch to begin 32nd West and 2nd North of S. 8th Sec 30 Twp R 4 E.

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There is to be an arm to Main ditch. Beginning about 5 rods South of the N.W. corner $\frac{5}{8} \frac{5}{8} \text{ NW } \frac{1}{4}$ Section 31 Township 30 Range 4. East. Running Thence $N 58^{\circ} 30'$ 300 ft. Thence $N 79^{\circ} 30'$ 95 ft and empties into main ditch 50 ft below Station 6.

The Main Ditch to be tiled with One row 8 inch tile from Station 0 to Station 6+50ft. and with two rows of 10 inch tile from Station 6+50ft. to Station 22+90. And two rows 12 inch tile from Station 22+90ft to Station 57+20ft and from Station 57+20ft to terminus. The ditch is to be open. One foot wide in bottom and banks cut with a 45° slope. The dirt to be excavated to be deposited not nearer than two feet from bank of bank. To be bouldered not nearer than two feet from bank of ditch at

the mouth of the tile at Station 57+20ft to afford free outlet to tile. This to be bouldered in bottom and around and on the tile to prevent washing out.

The arm to be tiled with one row, 8 inch tile.

The timber along said ditch to be deposited 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet away from banks on either side of ditch, same to be done by the owners of land where timber is grown.

GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS AND SUGGESTIONS.

The ditch is to be 30 ft wide at Station 57+20ft and is to be 10 ft wide at Station 0 to 57+20ft to level of ground. The fall in arm is 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ % per 100 feet.

The total fall is 18.3 feet to the Mill.

We change the course of said ditch as prayed for by the remonstrants. Making said ditch straight from Station 71 to Station 81. Then straight from 81 to Lemmons. (Said change in route does not practically change the cost of construction.)
