RE: Jacob Ehman Regulated Drain Reconstruction

Attached are a petition, plans, drain map, drainage shed map for the reconstruction of the Jacob Ehman Drain. The drainage area is located in Hamilton County, Indiana and benefits properties in Jackson Township Section 6, Township 20 North and Range 4 East. The petition was filed on April 23, 2015 by Beck's Family LP.

On December 8, 2014 a petition for reconstruction was of the Jacob Ehman Drain was approved by the Hamilton County Drainage Board (D.B. 16, Pages 57-58). This reconstruction begins at Station 24+10 of the original description which is at the manhole at the end point on the north side of 286th Street described in my report dated November 25, 2015. The drain will continue in a northerly direction following the existing 8" and 7" Jacob Ehman Drain to approximately Station 0+00 of the original description.

The existing 1982 feet of 12" tile on the Eliza Ruston Arm (aka Cassius Endicott Drain) to the Jacob Ehman Drain will be vacated from Station 0+00 to Station 15+50. A breather will be installed in the north R.O.W. of 286th Street at Station 15+50. The portion of the Eliza Ruston Arm from Station 15+50 to its outlet into the Jacob Ehman Drain at Station 20+16 shall remain in place.

The new construction will consist of: 1225 feet of 15" tile 1400' feet of 12" tile 1135 feet of 8" tile

The cost of the reconstruction is to be paid by Beck's Superior Hybrids. The tile will be reconstructed using Beck's equipment and personnel and will be inspected by this office. Because this portion of the reconstruction is to be paid by the petitioner and is within the boundaries of both petitioners' properties, this project falls under the requirements as set out in IC 36-9-27-52.5. Therefore a hearing is not required for the petition.

I recommend the Board approve this proposal.





FINAL INSPECTION REPORT

Please regard this letter as the inspector's final report on the Jacob Ehman Regulated Drain Reconstruction in Adams Township Sections 1, 2 and 12, Township 20 North and Range 3 East and Jackson Township Sections 6 and 7 Township 20 North and Range 4 East.

The hearing for the Jacob Ehman Regulated Drain Reconstruction was held on April 27, 2015 (D.B. 16 Pages 177-178). At that time the Board approved the project.

The Hamilton County Drainage Board approved the reconstruction of the Jacob Ehman Regulated Drain to be done by Beck's Hybrids. Beck's Hybrids paid all costs associated with the reconstruction. The plans were prepared for Beck's Hybrids by Byers Consulting, 1512 Castle Hills Drive, New Castle, Indiana.

The Jacob Ehman Regulated Drain Reconstruction consisted of 1,334 feet of 15"dual wall smooth bore HDPE pipe and 1,096 feet of 12"dual wall smooth bore HDPE pipe for a total of 2,430 feet of drain. This reconstruction began at Station 24+12 of the original description, Station 24+30 of the new stationing, which is at the manhole at the end point on the north side of 286th Street described in my report dated November 25, 2015. The drain continued in a northerly direction following the Jacob Ehman Drain to approximately Station 0+00 of the original description.


As of the date of this report, I hereby attest to and agree that the reconstruction have been installed according to the specified plans. All inspections have been completed. Mapping of the tile location was done by Beck's Hybrids.

The existing 1982 feet of 12" tile on the Eliza Ruston Arm (aka Cassius Endicott Drain) to the Jacob Ehman Drain was vacated from Station 0+00 to Station 19+82 which is located on the north side of 286th Street.

Beck's Hybrids provided a Cash Surety in the amount of \$62,483.15 for this project. This was released by the Board on March 28, 2016 (see Hamilton County Drainage Board Minutes Book 16, page 503). Submitted by:
