That as shown by said report they have definately determined the best and cheapest method of draining said lands; they have fixed the route, location and character of the proposed work and fixed the same by metes and bounds, courses, distances and descriptions, grades and bench marks so as to provide for the complete drainage of the lands to be effected by the proposed work. That they have divided the ditch or drain into sections, each not more than one hundred feet in length that they have computed the and set out the number of cubic yards of excavation in each station and they have assessed the benefits and damages as the case may be, to each separate tract of land and to the proper township where highways were benefit/ed; that they have fixed the beginning and outlet of said drain or ditch so as to secure the best results; that they have run the line of said ditch so as to secure the best results and cause the least cossible injury to the lands effected and so as to benefit the public highways; that said drain when completed will be practicable; that the profile public health will be improved; that a number of public highways will be benefited; that the ditch will be of public utility and that the cost, damages and expenses of completing the work will be less than the benefits to the owners of the lands likely to be assessed for the construction.

practicable; that the public health will be improved; that a number of public highways will be benefited; that the ditch will be of public utility and that the cost, damages and expenses of completing the work will be less than the benefits to the owners of the lands likely to be assessed for the construction.

LOCATION.

Beginning at a point 530 feet north and 165 feet east of the SW corner of section 22, township 18 north, range 3 East, and run thence S 81° E 200 feet, thence N 64° E 200 feet, thence south 54° E 200 feet, thence S 5°E 157 feet, thence S 50°E 243 feet, thence S 55°E 300 feet, thence S 24°E 167 feet, thence S 60°E 133 feet, thence S 75°E 600 feet, thence S 87°E 460 feet, thence S 73½°E 250 feet, thence S 60°E 400 feet, thence S 69°E 460 feet, thence S 34°E 140 feet, thence S 2°W 744 feet, thence S 78°E 354 feet, thence S 30°E 600 feet, thence S 3°E 560 feet to terminus. Total length of ditch 6160 feet.

REQUIREMENTS.

Ditch to consist of two rows of 10 inch tile from station 0 to station 0 plus 10, and two rows of ten inch sewer tile from station 0 plus 10 to station o plus 20 and a stone retaining wall 24 ft by 5½ ft by 2 ft and an open drain from station 0 plus 20 to station 61 plus 60 or terminus. Said open drain to be 2 feet wide in the bottom with side slopes of 45° or 1 to 1. All bushes and trees shall be cut and removed for a distance of 5 feet on each side of the ditch and all earth excavated shall be placed not nearer than 2 feet from the break of the banks. The line of the ditch shall follow the line of stakes as set by the Engineer and where the ditch follows the old channel the same shall be straightened so as to make a true line. All work to be done in a first class and workmanlike manner and to the full satisfaction of the Superintendent of Construction

At station 0 plus 20 to be constructed a stone retaining wall, dimensions of the same to be 24'X 5' X 2' and built to conform to the plans
