Re: Highland Springs Drain

Attached is the petition for the extension of the Highland Springs Drain. Included also is the aerial photo and drain map showing the approximate location of the proposed extension.

The proposed extension begins on the south line of lot 79 of Highland Springs and runs north along the east lot line approximately 70 feet; thence in a general northeasterly direction approximately 330 feet to an open ditch; thence running 100' downstream in a easterly direction following the existing open ditch. This description follows the approximate location of an existing 8" plastic tile installed by the developer of Highland Springs. The tile drain needs to be checked for possible obstructions and repaired if obstructions are found. Also, a stand pipe should be placed on the south line of lot 79 so as to be able to monitor the flow within the tile. A more accurate description can be developed when this work is being done.

At this time the drain is assessed at a rate of \$2.00 per acre with a \$20.00 minimum. The fund brings in \$1,790.00 per year and the current balance is \$8,620.40. This drain was not collected for 1995. I recommend that the assessment the drain remain at its current rate. I also do not believe any damages to property will result by the proposed extension.

I believe the drain to be within the platted easement along the east line of lot 79. However, tract 15-11-00-00-005, owned by Warren E. Stibbins Etal, will now have a regulated drain easement located across the property.

I recommend the Board set a hearing date for this matter for September 1995.
