Re: Highland Springs Drain Reconstruction

Attached are plans, specifications, drain map, drainage-shed map, and schedule of assessments for the Reconstruction of Highland Springs Drain located in Fall Creek Township. This proposal was petitioned by the homeowners within the Highland Springs Subdivision on September 17, 2005. This proposed project will dredge approximately 900 CYS of material from the channel between Highland Springs Drive and the northeast portion of the subdivision pond. Also, this project will repair a severe leak in the existing outlet and stand-pipe structure with a reinforced wall of GeoGuard 20 sheet piling.

The new regulated drain shall consist of that following:

36" CMP 305 feet Open Ditch 1,435 feet

The open ditch as listed above shall be the open channel from the new pipe as installed for Fox Hollow at Geist Section 3 as noted in my report dated January 12, 2005 and approved at hearing on February 28, 2005 (HCDB Minutes Book 8, Pages 189-191) to the pond in Block "A" of the Highland Springs, Section 1 Subdivision. This includes a straight line through the pond from inlet to outlet. It also includes the open ditch between the outlet of the 12" RCP between Lots 33 and 34 as described in my report dated December 29, 1982 and approved at hearing on March 7, 1983 (HCDB Minutes Book 1, Page 521), to the open ditch located in Block "A" of the Springs of Cambridge, Section 1 as described in my report dated December 16, 1993 and approved at hearing on March 28, 1994 (HCDB Minutes Book 3, Pages 231-232).

Highway Department and Town of Fishers will be assessed at \$100.00 per acre. Tract 13-15-11-04-01-036.000 should be assessed \$3,500.00. Tract 13-15-11-00-00-005.000 should be assessed \$500.00. Tract 13-15-11-04-01-035.001 should be assessed \$170.00. Tract 13-15-11-04-01-018.001 should be assessed \$85.00.

An assessment of \$1,500.00 per lot will be assessed to the lots around the lake for the construction. Those lots are as follows:

Easements for a portion of the work area are currently in place as shown on the plat for Highland Springs Section 1 as recorded on August 18, 1976 in the office of the Hamilton County Recorder in Book 6, Page 22. The plat calls for a drainage and utility easement (D & UE) 50' in width around the lake on Lots 1 to 13. The exception to this is Lot 2 which has an 80' drainage and utility easement. It also calls for a 20' easement along the east side of Block "B" which covers the dam. The RCP and Open Ditch between Lots 33 and 34 is covered by a 20' per half drainage and utility easement. New easements will be needed on Block "B", tract 13-15-11-04-01-035.000 owned by Mark & Margo C. Fritz and tract 13-15-11-04-01-035.001 owned by Donald F. & Doris M. Langebartels. The easement for the north-south open ditch shall be 35' per half and the easement for the east-west 36" pipe shall be 15' per half as based on the existing center lines of the pipe and open ditch.

I believe that no damages will result to landowners by the reconstruction of this drain. Therefore, damages for all tracts shall be set at \$0.00.

The maintenance assessments currently assessed for the Springs of Cambridge and Fox Hollow Drains shall remain the same at this time. The parcels listed below shall be added to the Highland Springs assessment roll for maintenance.

The pond is not to become part of the Highland Springs Drain. Only the inlet into the pond and the outlet shall become part of the regulated drain measured. Therefore, dredging of the pond and dam maintenance shall not be part of the maintenance under this regulated drain but shall remain the responsibility of the owner of the pond and those property owners abutting the pond. The existing outlet pipe will become regulated for the entire length of 305 feet of this 36" CMP conveyance.

The drainage area covers portions of Section 11, Township 17 North, Range 5East and consists of portions of Highland Springs and Fox Hollow. The Highland Springs Drain project will consist of a reconstruction of the pond outlet. Below is the hydraulic data for the existing pipe:

I have reviewed the drainage shed for Highland Springs Drain and the Fox Hollow at Geist, Sections 2 thru 5 and upon considering all parcels individually; I believe that each parcel within the drainage shed will have equal benefits by land use as provided by the drain unless noted otherwise below. Therefore I recommend each tract be assessed on the same basis equally by land use. I recommend that each tract be assessed as residential at a reconstruction assessment of \$170.00 per lot, the Hamilton County

This drain was designated an urban drain by the Board on March 7, 1983.

Upon a check of the McCordsville U.S.G.S. Quadrangle Map, I found that from the tile outlet on the west side of Highland Springs Drive to the confluence with Bills Branch, the length of drain is under 10 miles. Therefore, per IC14-28-1-22, a permit from IDNR is not required.

This project will not require a Rule 5 NPDES permit since the area of disturbed land will be less than 1 acre.

I recommend that the Board set a hearing for this reconstruction for August 27, 2007.



Dear Sir:

Please consider this letter a formal objection to the proposed assessment assigned to our property, which, for some unknown reason, consists of three "Parcels," and for which the subject letters indicate that our proposed assessment is more than twice that of all the other residents around the lake; i.e. \$3170.

We fail to understand why our proposed assessment should be any greater than that of the other residents, simply because our property - no larger than most of the others around the lake - has been broken up into three parcels. We are currently, in fact, working with DeBoy Land Development Surveyors to have our property re-platted such that it will consist of only one parcel. It is my understanding that you have been in contact with Michael DeBoy concerning this matter. With the approval of that replatting it seems to us that our proposed assessment should be the same as that of the other residents around the lake; i.e. \$1500.

Please take these facts into consideration, and please reconsider (and adjust) the proposed assessment for our property accordingly.

Thank you in advance for taking care of this matter.

### PRE-CONSTRUCTION MEETING:

At least ten (10) days prior to the commencement of the construction activities and no later than one (1) week after the bid is awarded to the Contractor a preconstruction meeting shall be scheduled. The scheduling and notification of such meeting shall be the responsibility of the County Surveyor's Office. Those invited shall be those listed as follows: County Surveyor or his representative, Contractor, Project Inspector, representative of Utilities in project area and any other interested parties.

# EXCAVATION (DREDGING):

Approximately 900 Cubic Yards of sediment shall be removed from the open ditch between Highland Springs Drive and the pond. This material is bottom sediment and banks should not be disturbed. All material must be removed from site. Limits of material removal shall be determined once the pond is drawn down for the repair of the pond outlet structure. Contractor shall use care so as not to damage yards in this area. Operation side shall be the north side of the open ditch and pond. If vacuum removal is utilized it shall be so stated on the bid form.

#### CLEARING:

Clearing shall be only those trees necessary to obtain access to the drain between the pond and Highland Springs Drive for the removal of sediment. Clearing shall also include the removal of the tree immediately west of the pond outlet structure. Clearing debris is to be removed from the project site.

# SEEDING / EROSION CONTROL:

Seeding shall be done on all disturbed yard areas. Seeding shall be done utilizing a yard seed mix. A 0.1 Acre area of disturbance has been estimated as needing reseeded. Contractor shall utilize proper erosion control during the project so as to reduce sediment back into the pond and to maintain yards and streets free from sedimentation and debris.

#### UTILITIES:


It shall be the Contractors responsibility to contact the owners of the various utilities before work is started. Utilities with known facilities within project area will forward to the Surveyor's Office a plat of their facilities. A copy of the plat will be forwarded to the Contractor for their records.


#### TRENCH SAFETY:

IOSHA Regulations 29 C.F.R. 1926, Subpart B are hereby incorporated with the contract documents. The Contractor shall incorporate the trench safety requirements as set out in the above mentioned regulations and such material, equipment, etc. required, shall be included in the cost of pipe installation.


# POND OUTLET STRUCTURE REPAIR:

The repair of the pond outlet structure shall completed as per the attached plans. The pond shall be drawn down so as to provide access to the structure for the repair. The leak in the existing 36 inch pipe shall be repaired and then the structure improved. The contractor shall drive geoguard 20 sheet piling around the existing structure and install a concrete base at the joint between the vertical and horizontal sections of the pipe. The area shall be backfilled with #8 stone and a concrete 6 inch concrete cap placed on top of the fill. A draw down pipe and trash guard and baffle plate shall also be installed. See the plan view, section A-A, section B-B, drawdown pipe design and rod trash guard detail for drop inlet design sheet.







SECTION A-A

# FINAL INSPECTION REPORT

This letter is the inspector's final report on the Highland Springs Regulated Drain Reconstruction, located in Sections 11, Township 17 North, Range 5 East, Fall Creek Township in Hamilton County, Indiana.

As of the date of this report, I hereby attest to and agree that the reconstruction was installed according to the specified plans and change orders. All inspections have been completed.

This project was approved per the Surveyor's Report dated July 9, 2007 at hearing on August 27, 2007. (See HCDB Minutes Book # 10, Pages 374 thru 379)

The Hamilton County Drainage Board awarded the contract on September 24<sup>th</sup>, 2007 to Rhino Trucking and Excavating.(See HCDB Minutes Book # 10, Page 428)

The project consisted of clearing, sediment removal, installation of 32 lineal feet of Geo Guard Sheet Pilling, tie back anchors, concrete cap, draw down pipe, trash guard, and seeding of disturbed areas. This adds 305 feet of 36" CMP and 1,435 feet of open ditch to the drain.

There was an Addendum on the project revising the amount of sediment removed from 900 cubic yards to 208 cubic yards. This reduced the dredging costs from \$49,995.00 to \$11,554.40. Changing the total reconstruction cost from \$84,995.00 to \$46,554.40. This Addendum can be found in Addendum Book #1, page 320.

A notarized statement of all expenses incurred for materials paid was received dated February 22nd, 2008.
