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VIEWERS' REPORT OF W. C. Clark DITCH.

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF HAMILTON COUNTY, IND.

We, the undersigned, appointed by this Court, at its June Prog. Term 1904 to view a drain described in the certified copy of a petition and order of court for a Drain by W. C. Clark and others, handed us by the Auditor, would represent that according to said order we, on the day named therein to-wit: The 12 day of July, 1904, in company with H. L. Furdley, a civil engineer, made an accurate survey of the line of said proposed _____ drain, from its source to its outlet. A plat of said _____ drain is filed herewith, including the survey by the engineer, marked "Exhibit B". We caused stakes to be set along said line, each one hundred feet, numbering down stream, as shown by plat. We also made a computation of the total number of cubic yards of dirt to be removed from said Drain, and estimated the total cost of the work at \$278.00 dollars. We have also set out, by a statement below, the names of the owners of lands benefited, with a description of each tract of land, and the amount assessed against each tract. The depth of cut, the width at bottom, and width at top along said drain, is also shown in a tabular statement in this report. After a full and careful view and examination, we are of the opinion that the Drain, as located by the survey, will be of public utility and convenience and that there are 1 or more public highways that will be greatly benefited thereby and that the cost of construction will be less than the benefit to be derived, and we are of the opinion that the best method to accomplish said drainage would be by a drain described elsewhere in this report.

Location

Beginning at a point 10ft East of NW Cor E 1/4 NE 1/4 Sec. 10 Twp. 18 N. Range 3 East - run line South - 600ft - then South 20° West - 100ft - then South - 800ft - line South 35° West - 54ft - and terminating in an open drain known as "Dry Branch" in SW 1/4 NE 1/4 Sec 10-18-3.

Requirements.

Said drain to consist of one row 10" drain tile from Sta 0 to Sta 7 and one row 12" drain tile from Sta 7 to Sta 15750 - and one row 12" Salt Glazed from Sta 15750 to 15754.

at Sta 15754 - to be constructed Stone Wall - Dimensions 8' x 5' x 2' said wall to be built from field rocks or virgin sands and laid up in mortar made from 1 part Portland Cement - to 2 parts good sand so constructed as to receive tile at proper grade 18" below base of wall

all tile used in construction of said drain to be first class in every respect - and to be bed laid in ditch with a true line both joints well matched and left uncovered until inspected and accepted by Co Surveyor then to be covered with earth to a depth of 24" where ditch is in old open channel and where ditch is new cut - trench to be filled full.
