

Attached is a petition, drain map and drainage shed map for Sections 7, 8 & 9 Arms to the Masthead Drain. The petition was filed in April 1992 by the Hamilton County Commissioners.

The petition is to place the drainage facilities in Sections 7, 8 & 9 of Masthead on a maintenance program. The drainage facilities in Sections 10 to 16 of Masthead are currently on a maintenance program. The facilities proposed to become part of the regulated drain are listed below by section.

- A) 135' 36" pipe under Fall Creek Road between lots 47 and 54 of Geist Woods and lot 215 of Masthead Section 7.


